• "JESUS REVEALED IN THE END TIMES" BOOK BY DR. ROBERT JEFFRES

This women's study will focus on Jesus as the Messiah, as the Prophet, as the Lamb, as the Conqueror, as the King, as the Judge, as the Lord, and as our Friend. Most books about the end times focus on the events rather than the One who is revealed in those events. We will study the end times through the lens of Jesus Christ. Class meets weekly on Wednesday evenings from 6 to 7:30pm in the Library.

Sunday, November 16th: Lord God, You are worthy of all praise, glory, and adoration! You are a good God, and a loving King. You can only do good towards Your people. Even when we cannot understand what is happening, or why evil increases, You are always good. Help us to keep our eyes on You, and to stand firm in our trust of You, no matter the chaos that swirls around us. For Your glory, others' gain, and our good we pray these things, Amen.

Monday, November 17th: Prayerfully read or listen to Proverbs 3:5-6 with the following verses: Psalm 37:3-5, 62:8; Isaiah 26:3-4; Jeremiah 17:7-8; Matthew 6:25-34; John 14:1; Romans 8:28; Philippians 4:6-7; 1 Peter 5:7. How do these various passages support what the verses in Proverbs state? If you can, create a spreadsheet (either in a journal, your computer, or handwritten on a page of paper) and note what each passage says about trusting in God. Refer to it throughout the week. Tuesday, November 18th: Prayerfully read or listen to Proverbs 3:5a. The Hebrew word for "trust" means "to trust, be confident, or sure; it expresses the feeling of safety and security that is felt when one can rely on someone..." Would you describe your feeling of "trusting God" in this way? Do you "feel safe and secure" with Him? Are you confident and sure of Him "with all your heart?" For example – do you trust Him with your salvation, and do you trust Him (are you sure of, confident with, fully safe and secure) with the lives of your children and/or loved ones? If there are any "sticking points" where you can sense that your trust in God is not where you want it to be, take time today and pray with Him about it.

Wednesday, November 19th: Prayerfully read or listen to Proverbs 3:5b. What do you think it means to "lean not on your own understanding?" Have you had a time in your life when the Lord very specifically told you to do something, but it was not necessarily the "right" or "normal" thing to do according to the culture or what your friends or family would tell you to do? What are some things we are called to do as Believers that the culture of our day tells us to do differently? Are you following Scripture or are you following the culture?

Thursday, November 20th: Prayerfully read or listen to Proverbs 3:6a. There is a 3-letter word in the first phrase. What is it? What does it mean? How encompassing to your life is it? In the Hebrew, this word means "altogether, any, enough, every, whatsoever, the whole, as many as..." Frankly, this word doesn't leave anything out. There are no loopholes here. Every single portion of your life is to acknowledge (ESV, NASB, NKJV) the Lord/be submitted to Him (NIV). Take time and pray about and journal through this. What aspects of your life are fully submitted to Him, and in what areas of do you still need to bring under His Lordship? Let the light of His Holy Spirit and His presence be with you during this time of prayer!

Friday, November 21st: Prayerfully read or listen to Proverbs 3:6b. What is the strong promise given in this part of the verse? When have you seen the Lord prove Himself to you like this? Are you in a season of waiting to see your paths made straight? What can you take away from this week's lessons, readings, and times of prayer?

Saturday, November 22nd: Review each of these Scriptures, topics, and questions that you have worked through this week. How does all of this resonate with you? Pray through these things as the Spirit leads you!
