Erica's Wish began in 2009 to give a birthday celebration to a young girl who was battling Osteosarcoma (bone cancer). The same cancer that Terry Fox had. Erica, like Terry had a leg amputation and a grueling set of 67 rounds of chemo to fight this horrible disease. All this at the tender age of 12.

Race Director and Founder, Sue Strong asked Erica what she wanted to do for her 13th birthday. Erica stated "I want to bring awareness of childhood cancer by way of a race with cupcakes at the finish line" and so Erica's Wish began.

The event was meant to run for 5 years (but ended up going 6) with a specific word each year being the theme.

BELIEVE. COURAGE. STRENGTH. DETERMINATION. WISDOM.

In 2015, we made the difficult decision to cancel the event when we realized Erica wouldn't be at the start line to greet everyone as she always had. Instead, she was pursuing her dream—training for the Rio Paralympics. Despite the cancellation, the Blanket Program continued to thrive, with countless supporters contributing because of their love for the initiative.

Erica's Paralympic journey didn't end in Rio. She proudly competed in Paris 2024 in the sport of Paracanoe. This achievement felt almost destined, given Erica's athletic roots as a provincial gymnast before her diagnosis.

Her journey began during a gymnastics practice when she heard a pop and discovered something was seriously wrong with her leg. That moment led to a diagnosis of Osteosarcoma and set her on a path of resilience and determination.

Since the very beginning in 2009, Erica has been the heart and soul of this program, inspiring the Erica's Wish community as we've cheered her on through every milestone and triumph.
