The Chapel's blessed Statue of Our Lady is being shared with families in our parish.

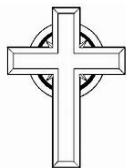

**Thursday Evening, October 20th**

Heralded as one of the most inspiring films in recent years. *Therèse* recounts the life of Thérèse of Lisieux. Through the rigors of monastic life, she made the surprising yet simple discovery that holiness can be achieved by small acts of love and compassion—a spiritual path she called her Little Way.

This is the enthralling story of a young girl's romance with God. Her faith, trials, and sacrifices that reveal a way of life based on love and simplicity. It is based on the true story of **Saint Thérèse of Lisieux**. She was declared the **greatest saint of modern times** by Pope Pius X. **Canonized in 1925**. Her memoir, **Story of a Soul**, has been translated into over 60 languages and has sold over 100 million copies. In 1997 **Pope St. John Paul II** declared her a **Doctor of the Universal Church** – only the third woman up to that time so honored.

**PERSISTENCE**

Exodus recounts the journey of the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt to the land promised to their ancestors. It was not an easy journey. In today's reading, they are attacked by Amalek and his soldiers, members of one of the peoples who live in the land through which the Israelites are traveling. Moses was on the hilltop with his arms raised to invoke the LORD's assistance in the battle below, a powerful illustration of the LORD's favor upon Israel. If the soldiers were to lift up their eyes to that hill (see Psalm 121:1), they would be reassured by Moses's presence and posture. Paul urges the Thessalonians to persist in proclaiming the gospel, and Jesus likewise commends the widow for her persistence in pursuit of the justice due her. Whether they preach or pray, the followers of Jesus need persistence through periods of difficulty.
