**SAINT MARIA GORETTI
VIRGIN & MARTYR
PROTECTOR OF YOUNG WOMEN
FEAST DAY
WEDNESDAY, JULY 6**

Maria was born in 1890 in a poor family at Corinaldo, Italy. When her father died, ten-year old Maria took care of the house and her brothers .

Pestered and stalked by the amorous advances of a young male neighbor, she resisted him, even when he severely threatened her. Finally, stabbing her to death while she was resisting rape she forgave **him of his crime** and **maintaining intact her virginity**.

Her assailant was sentenced to 30 years in prison during which time he repented and reformed his life. He later joined a monastic life. He was one of the witnesses who testified to **Maria's holiness** during her cause of beatification which occurred in 1945. **He also was present at her canonization** by Pope Pius XII in 1950, when she became the **youngest Roman Catholic saint** officially recognized by name.

Maria reminds today's youth of the third millennium that true happiness demands courage and a spirit of sacrifice, refusing every compromise with evil and having the disposition to pay personally, even with death, remaining faithful to God and his commandments."

WHAT IS EUCHARISTIC ADORATION?

Adoration of the **Blessed Sacrament** is an ancient prayer of the Church. Adoration can take place in any church or chapel where the Blessed Sacrament (the Real Presence of Christ) is kept on reserve (in the tabernacle) or exposed (when a Consecrated Host is taken from the tabernacle and placed in a Monstrance which "exposes" the host for all to see).

In the Chapel, the Blessed Sacrament is always kept on reserve in our tabernacle, located in the Sanctuary behind the Altar.

Pope John Paul II wrote in his Letter on the 750th Anniversary of the Feast of Corpus Christi "When remaining in silence before the Blessed Sacrament, it is Christ totally and really present whom we discover, whom we adore, and with whom we are in contact."

Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament is one way to nourish our spiritual lives. Spending silent time before the Blessed Sacrament to speak with Jesus and to listen to Him (whether in the tabernacle or on exposition) should lead us to act more like Christ in our lives and build His Kingdom on Earth.

Docent Tours of Christ Cathedral are returning this summer!

Guided walks of the Garden Grove campus first began in 2012 after the Diocese of Orange acquired the property, but they stopped due to the pandemic closures in March 2020.

GOOD NEWS IS ON THE WAY

This week, in the midst of summer, the scriptures greet us with joy, peace, mercy, and more peace! We often associate the prophet Isaiah with that preparatory season, and our first reading rings with such words as exult, comfort, and rejoice. The Israelites had reason to rejoice, for they had returned, come home, to a rebuilt Jerusalem from their exile in Babylon.

In the Gospel, the seventy-two disciples who were sent out have their own "homecoming," returning to Jesus from spreading the Good News of the Kingdom and preparing people for the "advent" of Jesus into their cities and towns on his long road to Jerusalem. Like the exiles in Isaiah, the disciples return rejoicing.

The Good News, the Kingdom of God, is coming, even in summer. As today's psalm reminds us, "Shout joyfully to God, all the earth!"
