34th ANNUAL RED MASS MONDAY, OCTOBER 3 CHRIST CATHEDRAL

The Cathedral is hosting the 34th annual Red Mass at **6 p.m. Oct. 3**, a Mass for the legal community hosted by the St. Thomas More Society that is celebrated at the opening of the judicial year in Orange County and throughout the world.

Bishop Kevin Vann is the celebrant, with our very own Msgr. Douglas Cook, JCL as homilist and Orange County Superior Court Judge Julie A. Palafox as the St. Thomas More Society honoree.

Judges attending the Red Mass in Orange County traditionally wear red robes in a renewal of an ancient tradition practiced for hundreds of years after the institution of the Red Mass in the 13th century.

The custom received its distinguished name from the brilliant scarlet vestments worn by the Mass celebrant and Lord High Justices in England. The St. Thomas More Society is an independent organization sponsored by lawyers, judges and college law professors who are practicing members of the Roman Catholic Church. Part of its mission is to provide opportunities for the Catholic legal community to strengthen faith through education, fellowship and prayer.



MASS INTENTIONS

The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass may be offered for many reasons, including (1) the repose of the soul of a loved one, (2) the intentions of living persons in need, (3) upon the occasions of someone's birthday or anniversary, and (4) in thanksgiving for blessings re-received.

Infinite graces flow from the Sacrifice Christ made on the Cross which is present at every Eucharist.

An offering is traditionally included with the request for Mass intentions, and Mass cards are available to give to the persons for whom the Mass is offered or their family. Please contact the parish office at (949) 673-3801 for more information.

CARE FOR EACH OTHER

Don't delude yourselves, Jesus says through the parable of the rich man and Lazarus. We really are supposed to care for others. It is not enough to go to Mass and occasionally serve at a parish or outreach function. We cannot remain complacent and consider ourselves followers of Jesus. No matter how much or how little material wealth we have, we always have something to give—our time and attention, care, and, when possible, our money.
