Dear Siblings in Christ,

Summer has arrived—bringing with it warmer days, the laughter of children playing outside, backyard barbecues, time at the lake, and a slower, gentler rhythm for many of us. And in the midst of it all, Psalm 46 calls out with a voice both ancient and fresh:

"Be still, and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10)

There is something profoundly *summery* about that verse. But summer often offers us glimpses of the stillness God invites us into: moments of rest, awe at creation, and unhurried time to breathe.

Whether you're near or far, please know that your church family is praying for you. We'll have some wonderful events happening this summer: outdoor worship, fellowship gatherings, and yes—even Bible study with pulled pork and lawn chairs!

So, wherever you are—whether at the beach, on the farm, in the city, or resting at home—I encourage you to take time this summer to "be still." Not to do nothing, but to intentionally pause. Listen for the Spirit. Let your soul be reminded that you are not alone. God is with you. God is for you. God is your refuge.

May this summer bring rest to your body, joy to your spirit, and the quiet confidence that comes from trusting in the One who "makes wars cease," "lifts up the lowly," and "dwells with us" in every season.

### Mortgage Debt Reduction Update

By the grace of God and YOUR generosity, as of June 2, 2025, by the end of the year, we will pay a minimum of an additional \$52,056.72 towards our mortgage principal!

#### Here are some interesting numbers that were shared at our Annual Meeting:

- ◆ Current Mortgage Balance: \$969,201
- ◆ Current Mortgage Payment: \$9,178
- ◆ Rate: 8%

Mortgage Balance

**Total Liabilities** 

- ◆ Balance as of January 2025 = 16.82 years to pay off
- ◆ Balance as of May 31, 2025 (after these Step Up in Faith donations) = 15.26 years. Saves us \$156,026 in interest (about 17 months).
- ◆ If we can pay \$9,178 per month (normal payment), and a \$50,000 principal reduction every year, at 8% our building will be completely paid for in...8 years, 5 months!
- ◆ If the rate drops to 7%, our building will be paid off in 7.9 years.

# **Spotlight on Faith Community Nursing**

There are so many things that we are exposed to everyday, but have you ever wondered what a faith community nurse does in a community? Did you know there are over 15,000 Faith Community Nurses, primarily in the United States? The nurse is a registered nurse with additional education in community health and parish nursing.

The purpose of faith community nursing is to nurture the human spirit through health education, spiritual support and linking the needs of the whole person to resources withing the congregation, community and health care system.

Our Nurse Sue provides spiritual and social support and advocacy resources that address health inequities in the Kenosha community where she serves. She also provides referrals to specialists and community resources, hosts whole-person health-promoting activities/training focused on mind, body, and spirit, provides education and/or series addressing health issues, and helps community/ congregational members manage and prevent chronic diseases. Nurse Sue continually offers an opportunity for conversation and listening from our parishioners and the community regarding mental, physical, emotional and health concerns.

Lord of Life Lutheran has partnered with Nurse Sue throughout the years and experienced championing grief and caregiver support group opportunities, hosting blood drives, and facilitating Healthy Heart Fairs to name a few.

Nurse Sue partners and offers health expertise to local emergency resources that serve the community, addressing food insecurity and housing support to those in crisis zip code areas in Kenosha. Lord of Life has been a big part of this outstretching ministry of care as the hands and feet of Christ in the Kenosha community.


