

5 FROM THE PARISH NURSE

Dear friends,

I will be offering a free Companionship workshop on Thursday, June 19th from 9:30 am to 2 pm at Lord of Life Lutheran Church, 5601 Washington Road. Those that volunteer or are thinking about volunteering in the community/neighborhood would benefit from the training.

The Companionship workshop is a Pathways to Promise program, a multifaith and multicultural mental health support organization. The program was developed in 1987 by Rev. Craig Rennebohm and others. It aims to address the need for comprehensive mental health support for individuals living with mental health conditions and their support networks. The model is rooted in our natural capacities to be sensitive, compassionate, and concerned for another person in distress.

We use this workshop to educate faith and health working leaders with practices, guidelines, and settings by responding relationally to others who are experiencing difficult times (isolation, loneliness, suffering, homelessness) and in need of healing support.

The session's goals are:

- ◆ To inform Faith and Health work leaders about the various challenges individuals face when they are in distress.
- ◆ To equip Faith and Health work leaders with five practices of Hospitality, Neighboring, Journeying Side by Side, Listening, and Accompaniment, and demonstrate how to integrate these practices when responding to individuals in need of healing and recovery.
- ◆ To train Faith and Health working leaders to utilize their natural abilities to establish relationships with people, especially in the fast pace of life and walking with someone facing a mental health challenge.
- ◆ To emphasize the significance of healthy relationships for good mental health and well-being and to promote self-care for leaders.

Please register by Monday, June 9th. Call the Lord of Life office at 262-656-1995. Include your name, phone number and e-mail address. Orders for free lunch meal choices will be obtained at registration. A free workbook will be provided for the training. Limited seats are available at this event so sign up ASAP to reserve your space. Thank you for considering this event!

CELEBRATING 40 YEARS

Thoughts from Pastor Jack Ottoson, Mission Developer of Lord of Life

I paused to pray, ponder and remember those early, inspiring years of mission development. My memory was helped by looking at the earliest church photo directories from 1988, 1992 and 1996. I also kept an essay, "Historical Reflections", written by one of Lord of Life's earliest members, Mary Jane Dey. She penned the reflections on March 23, 2003. (maybe in anticipation of Lord of Life's 20 year anniversary?)

One of the hazards of a preaching and writing is length, as in, "that was way too long". So, these reflections can be edited, eliminated, incorporated or used in any way you deem fitting. Here goes...

- 1. The first meeting of the new mission development happened in the fall of 1984 at the home of Jim & Karen Kinsman. There were 7 people present. (Susan Thompson-Division of Service and Mission in America for the American Lutheran Church, Jim & Karen Kinsman, Jack and Kathy Ottoson, Barb and Mike Menzhuber)
- 2. In December an invitation was placed in the Kenosha News. Anyone interested in a new Lutheran church starting on the northwest side of Kenosha can "Join Us" at the Carthage College Christmas concert. Here is how Mary Jane Dey describes the post concert coffee and fellowship at the Ottoson home. "The room there is as vividly real today as it was then. Terra, three years old, sang "Joy to the World" beside a thirty birthday candle Advent log. Our spritual and emotional involvement was almost tangible in the still and festive glow."
- 3. Karen Kinsman and Phyllis Brendt of St. Mary's Lutheran in Kenosha made the first worship banner for Lord of Life. The words reminded worshippers of the centrality of our mission. The banner simply proclaimed, "We are the Church".
- 4. The early years of ministry was housed in places that were begged and borrowed. We met in Bullen Jr. High School, homes of members, Washington Manor nursing home, neighbor churches(1st Baptist, St. Peter's Catholic, 2nd Baptist) The name, Lord of Life Lutheran, was chosen at a meeting in Pete's Pub. No kidding, this was the bar located in the basement of St. Peter's Catholic Church.
- 5. The 1988 photo directory of Lord of Life has photos of our members planting pine trees on the south border of our property. Another photo shows how we made signs with family names and placed the signs by the rows of trees. Lord of Life families would load their cars with jugs of water to hand water their row of growing seedlings. There is probably a good sermon illustration in this story.
- 6. Greta Hanson, a devout member of St. Mary's Lutheran, was instrumental in the work of the Shalom Soup kitchen located in inner city Kenosha. An early Lord of Life member, Don Foote, told me how proud and moved to tears he was the first time he placed the sign up that declared, "Today you are being served by Lord of Life Lutheran Church".
- 7. A fierce northeasterly storm blew down all the Lord of Life roof trusses during construction. I turn again to Mary Jane Dey's, Historical Recollections. "One windy night Werner (Mary Jane's husband) sat bolt upright in bed." "Those rafters are nailed from the wrong side and they are coming down!" Werner was not a prophet, he was, however, an exceptionally skilled and trained carpenter. He knew what that wind could do to those rafters. They toppled like dominoes. The next Sunday what hymn do you suppose we sang? That's right, "Built on a rock the church shall stand, even when steeples are falling..."
- 8. During construction, before the 2 by 4 wooden wall studs were covered in drywall, the contractor allowed us inside the building. Members used felt tipped pens to write prayers and memorials on the wooden studs. It was a witness to the fact that the building was built BOTH with wood and with prayer.
- 9. After moving into our new church building in May of 199I our members voted to be one of the sites where homeless could have a warm place to sleep on cold winter nights. The program was a ministry of the Shalom Center and was called the INNS program. I believe our night to house the homeless was Sunday? The Alder woman of our district led a town hall meeting for any citizens who lived in the area near our church. As you can imagine, there was a lot of resistance or NIMBY. (Not In Our Backyard). Hopeful members and Greta Hanson, representing the INNS program, were there. As we left the meeting that evening I turned to Greta Hanson and said, "I will never be more proud of the church members I serve, as I am tonight."
- 10. So many stories, faces, sights and sounds fill my spirit during this exercise in memory. These are words from the pastor's page in the 1988 church photo directory. "While the faces in this body of believers may change, let us pray that the spirit never does. It is the spirit of caring and friendship that makes Lord of Life special. That spirit will cause our congregation to grow in greater service in Jesus' name."

It is wonderful to remember with affection but not glorification. After these ten inspiring memories, I am reminded of the wisdom/wit of church historian, Dr. Martin Marty. He once said, "There is no such thing as the golden age of the church. The closest we ever got was yellow."

Wishing you God's greatest blessings on Lord of Life's 40th anniversary!
