July 16, 2019 Meeting Notes

- Angie Wollschlager, Church Administrator, attended the meeting and distributed keys and access cards and sign-up sheets for Council members to sign up for dinner and devotions for the monthly meetings, and writing a monthly newsletter submission.
- Pastor Adam distributed copies of the Council officer job descriptions from our Bylaws and the floor was
 opened for Council members to volunteer for officer positions. The outcome of this discussion was the approval of the following officers: Jackie McCarthy as President, Joe Nosalik as Vice President, Brian Lynch as Treasurer, and John Meyer as Secretary. Due to the scheduling needs of many of the Council members, the regular
 monthly meeting will now be held on the second Tuesday of each month.
- Pastor Adam gave a verbal report as this is a new Council and new Treasurer, and there hasn't been a
 Finance Team meeting as of yet. Quite simply, last year was tough, but we are moving forward.
- Angie and Pastor Adam shared that an outside organization, Our Harmony Club, has approached Lord of Life
 about the possibility of using our Fellowship Hall on a regular basis. Their program provides social day programs
 for elderly members of the community with age related challenges. Council approved moving forward with
 discussing this possibility with Our Harmony Club. Kenosha no longer has a program like this in our community,
 as KAFASI (Kenosha Area Family and Aging Services, Inc.) has ended their Daybreak program.
- Pastor Adam proposed the idea of continuing with one worship gathering on Sunday mornings. The idea is
 that worship would be held from 9:00-10:00 a.m. and Empower Hour (education for all ages) would be held
 from 10:30-11:30 a.m. Council asked for attendance data and that a survey be sent to the congregation regarding this proposal before a decision is made.




6 FROM THE PARISH NURSE

Dear friends,

Summer is sizzling, people are traveling, and life is happening. Here is an opportunity to help three lives in one donation. Bonus: Amazon is thanking all donors with a \$5 Amazon.com gift card.

During times of heavy travel, the blood supply in many areas of the country gets depleted. On Thursday, August 15th from 1 to 6 p.m., Lord of Life will be hosting the American Red



Cross. Our own high school student, Brittany Kugler will be co-coordinating the event. You and many others will be encouraged to share your precious blood in order to save someone's life. Donating blood is an awesome, selfless act and gift that will benefit a stranger or possibly a loved one in need.

- ♥ What can I expect at my donation?
 - In a confidential and private setting at Lord of Life, you'll answer some questions about your health history and places you have traveled. The Red Cross staff will take your blood pressure, temperature, and a small sample of your blood to test your iron. Then the trained staff will cleanse the area of your arm and insert a sterile needle, through which the blood will be drawn from your arm. After donation, you can relax in the refreshment area; enjoy a snack and beverage provided by your Lord of Life family. (We will even hold your hand for comfort, if necessary)
- Can I find out my blood type?
 Yes, about six weeks after your donation, you will receive a donor card in the mail bearing your blood type.
- How often may I donate blood?
 You may donate whole blood every 56 days
- ♥ Will I have to limit my activities after donating?
 - We ask donors not to do any strenuous activity or heavy lifting for several hours after donating. You may want to schedule your appointment several hours before or after planned exercise. Your fluid levels will be back to normal within 24 hours and you will use 650 calories when donating!!!!!

Lord of Life donors can schedule themselves for the August 15th donation day by using a computer: visit the website www.red<u>rossblood.org</u>

- 1. Enter in our ZIP code (53144)
- 2. Click on the blue arrow
- 3. Search for our blood drive (Lord of Life Lutheran)
- 4. Click on the red arrow on the right, then tap on the time box you want to schedule for an appointment
- 5. Or donors can schedule themselves by calling: 1.800.RED.CROSS (1.800.732.2767) and speak with a Red Cross representative.
- 6. Sign-up will also be offered between services in early August.

Hold off donating blood from June 20nd until this drive...56 days between donations is required.

Giving blood is a demonstration of our commitment to serving others in our state and nation. It is a blessing and provides another ministry opportunity for our congregation. Come out and join in the summer fun! See you at the Drive!!!

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

More Than All Are Welcome!

It sounds great doesn't...ALL are welcome. And while many churches claim this platitude, I am proud that Lord of Life intentionally lives out the Gospel truth of this saying. We welcome guests when they visit, we proclaim God's love for ALL people within worship, and we seek to see Christ in all who come through our doors. Yet, what if living into our call requires more than offering a welcoming relationship with those who come to us? What if, to reveal God's presence in and through our relationships, we are called to go out and invite others into a loving relationship?

I know, I know...inviting people to church seems weird, seems a bit too Evangelical. "Hello friend, would you like to join me in experiencing the love of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ?" Let's leave that kind of evangelism to the Mormons and Jehovah Witnesses. Yet, at the end of every worship gathering, we are sent out into the world. We are sent renewed in prayer and praise, nourished with the body and blood, reassured and empowered with God's love and grace. We say, "Go in peace. Let the service begin," and I pray that in our actions others will know God's love. But I think that our call requires more than acts of service. We are called to proclaim in our words the Good News made known to us by faith.

Now, I am not saying that you need to stand in the public arena with a megaphone declaring Christ as Lord. I am not even saying that we have to bring up our Christian theology over coffee with friends. I am asking that we explore and consider what our lives and the life of our congregation will experience if we deepen our call beyond welcome to intentional invitation. What if our lives invited others to inquire about our acts of love? What if our words of compassion ended with an invitation for friends and family to experience what we experience in and through our Lord of Life worship and ministries?

If you have been at church in July, you know that I have challenged our congregation to "Start With Why." So we ask, "Why should we invite our family and friends to church with us?" Yes...there is the practical reality that in order for our congregation to grow, we need new people to come; bringing their gifts, sharing their perspective as we grow together in faith! And yes...there is the scriptural command by Christ to "make disciples of all." So in faith, we seek to bring folks to hear the proclamation of the Good News of God's Love for ALL people, that they may know the joy that has been revealed through Christ. But honestly, I think that the strongest reason for inviting others to church with you needs to be rooted in our WHY. Why do you come to church? My prayer is that one of the reasons, if not the main reason, is because you experience God in and through this community, that your relationship with God is deepened in and through the relationships you have developed within our congregation.

The truth is, congregations smaller than us thrive in their active faith...more people aren't required for us to deepen our relationships with one another and with God. And while spreading the Good News is important, our efforts to raise awareness of God's love doesn't change the truth of God's love. That is to say, all people are loved whether they ever come to church or not. So growing our church and "saving" our neighbor are not strong WHYs. We invite others into relationship with our congregation not because of what they can do for us or what we can do for them, but because of what God can reveal in and through our relationships rooted in faith and lived out in love.

So here is my challenge, beloved...let us be intentionally invitational. Invite your family and friends to join you on a Sunday morning or evening. Invite families to experience our Sunday School and Youth Ministries. Invite friends to come to our Soul Food book study, to God's Work Our Hands Weekend, to a G.I.G.G.L.E.S Night. As we find value and meaning in our faith family, let us go out and invite others into relationship with us, that through these relationships we ALL might more fully experience our God of unconditional Love.
