Sitting at a Brewers game, in the bottom of the 2nd inning, these words formed in my head. Now, what could have inspired the words? Actually, it wasn't the game. I was thinking about life in general. I suppose that it isn't the first time a baseball game inspired thoughts about life. I recall back a number of years, in the middle of the season, it wasn't unusual to think, "well, there's always next year." I recall after graduation from Seminex, Christ Seminary in Exile, the school I attended after the Missouri Synod split, it felt like forever, worried about whether I would get a call. There was deeply mixed feeling about the graduate "rebels" who dared to walk out of the centuries old school and tradition based on freedom to understand and study the Bible in ways that were different. I also recall waiting during the 36 hours of labor for our first child, next to my wife in the fear and panic of that time.

Waiting can be filled with fear. It must have felt like interminable during the time since you lost your last pastor until now. Transitions are not easy and you have had several in the interim. I can only imagine that it sounded like a relief to have been told by the council that there was good news. Perhaps your time of waiting has come to end.

The true value of waiting is what God can do during the interim. It is a time of drawing near to God and asking for revelation. The revelation of what is going on in the midst of your congregation, and within yourself can be the time of coming to know the truth of how close God has drawn to you. Look back at the time and see how God has brought you closer to each and to the Lord. Look back and see how God has provided all that you needed in times of real confusion and difficulty. Look back and see how God has given the Spirit to guide you along the way toward your goal.

Look back and find God's presence because you will be coming into the transition of new leadership. It will be a time of discovery and growth, and you will be able to see what God has taught you in your time of waiting. In truth, we are all waiting for the coming of the final chapter of God's kingdom since that day that Jesus walked out of the tomb. We know that we have promise ahead and the fullness of God's love. For this we wait.

Faith can be a funny thing. It can be weak, fickle, steadfast or strong. "Some people are like seeds on rocky soil. They welcome the word with joy whenever they hear it, but they don't develop any roots. They believe for a while, but when their faith is tested, they abandon it. The seeds that were planted among thorn bushes are people who hear the word, but as life goes on the worries, riches, and pleasures of life choke them. So they don't produce anything good. The seeds that were planted on good ground are people who also hear the word. But they keep it in their good and honest hearts and produce what is good despite what life may bring." *Luke 8:13-15*

Clearly Jesus teaches us that we should be faithful. Things in everyday life take faith to work, just as the functions of a church run on faith. Faith that our aspirations will become a reality. Faith that our needs will be fulfilled.

Each and every one of us at Lord of Life that voted "Yes" for the 2022 budget did so on faith. Let's face it, who in their right mind would vote "Yes" for a \$50,000 deficit budget? None of us had any idea where the money to cover the ongoing expenses would come from. Clearly there is faith in our God being one of abundance and that abundance will be shared. I suppose we all hope that our faith will be rewarded in turn. With some diligent accounting and maybe a little miracle, a good portion of our deficit will be erased this year by a \$39,573 Employee Retention Credit from the Federal Government.

Just as in verse above from Luke, the seeds were planted on good ground and produce what is good despite what life may bring. This is our faith being rewarded in turn for the good and honest hearts that hear the word.

The retention credit will certainly be a boost in the arm to for Lord of Life's operational budget. And we still have an unmet matching challenge gift of \$10,000 out there. LoL has received \$6,235 in new intents so far in 2022. Please know there is still time to submit your Intention Card to help LoL achieve the match the \$10,000. Your support comes at a time of transition when we need it more than never – a true testament to faithfulness!

Financial stewardship is a necessity to continuing God's work at Lord of Life. Also important is sharing your time and talents; these powerful expressions of faith help lead worship services, Sunday school, and care for our building and grounds with careful maintenance. Don't forget to sign up and be an active part of Lord of Life.

It is an exciting time for Lord of Life – our prayers have been answered and a new Pastor is being called to serve our faith community. What a blessing! What an opportunity for our faith family to engage (or re-engage) to share the responsibility of shining light, sharing our faith, for each other and our greater Kenosha and global communities.

Our prayers are being answered and our faith is being rewarded. Indeed the Lord continues to provide!
