

Greetings, Siblings!

One of my favorite stories about Jesus from the Gospel of Luke is about Jesus but also about what friends do for friends. Maybe you remember it? It is in the fifth chapter of Luke and tells the story about a paralytic man whose friends took him to Jesus to be healed. When they got to the place where Jesus was, it was so crowded that they couldn't get in. Not being deterred, they went to the roof and lowered him down to Jesus that way. Jesus then heals the man (I shortened the story but, if you want to read the whole story it's Luke 5:17-26).

Yes, this story tells of how Jesus has the power to heal but, like I stated, it also tells about friends. We don't know any of this man's back story or even the men who brought them to Jesus but, I have to believe, that they were friends. Who else would carry someone for healing? It could've been a block they travelled or it could have been a mile (or further!). Carrying someone isn't easy even with help. Further, who would dig through a roof (clawing with their bare hands) to make a hole big enough to lower a grown man through? The answer to both of these questions can only be people who care enough to see the mission through...friends.

Summertime is a time for friends. A time when we get together for backyard barbeques, festivals and to enjoy a refreshing libation. Even so, there are times when we aren't always aware of who among us might be struggling. I know that in my own life there have been times where I chose to struggle alone until someone reached out and went beyond the cursory "what's up?" to really being present with me and asking "how are you really doing?"

As we get together over the next few months (at church or in the backyard), I'm going to work to be more aware and ask myself some questions when I'm with my friends. Questions like.....Who might be paralyzed by the struggles in their life? Who might need me to carry them? Who might need me to claw through the barriers separating them from Jesus to meet Him and be healed?

Will you join me in being more aware? The best present we can give anyone is our actual presence. Enjoy the summer and enjoy your friends!


FROM THE PARISH NURSE

Summer is sizzling, people are traveling, and life is happening. Here is an opportunity to help three lives in one donation. Bonus: Amazon is thanking all donors with a \$20 Amazon gift card by email.

During times of heavy travel, the blood supply in many areas of the country gets depleted. On Thursday, August 15th from 1 to 6 p.m., Lord of Life will be hosting the American Red



Cross. You and many others will be encouraged to share your precious blood in order to save someone's life. Donating blood is an awesome, selfless act and gift that will benefit a stranger or possibly a loved one in need.

• What can I expect at my donation?

In a confidential and private setting at Lord of Life, you'll answer some questions about your health history and places you have traveled. The Red Cross staff will take your blood pressure, temperature, and a small sample of your blood to test your iron. Then the trained staff will cleanse the area of your arm and insert a sterile needle, through which the blood will be drawn from your arm. After donation, you can relax in the refreshment area; enjoy a snack and beverage provided by your Lord of Life family. (We will even hold your hand for comfort, if necessary)

- Can I find out my blood type? Yes, about six weeks after your donation, you will receive a donor card in the mail bearing your blood type.
- How often may I donate blood? You may donate whole blood every 56 days
- Will I have to limit my activities after donating? We ask donors not to do any strenuous activity or heavy lifting for several hours after donating. You may want to schedule your appointment several hours before or after planned exercise. Your fluid levels will be back to normal within 24 hours and you will use 650 calories when donating!!!!!

Lord of Life donors can schedule themselves for the August 15th donation day by using a computer: Visit the website <u>www.redcrossblood.org</u>

- 1. Under the "Critical Need for Blood Donors" box, enter ZIP code 53144 and click MAKE AN APPOINTMENT
- 2. Scroll until you find our blood drive (Lord of Life Lutheran Church) and click SEE TIMES

3. Click on the time box you want to schedule for an appointment and complete the information. 4. Or donors can schedule themselves by calling: 1.800.RED.CROSS (1.800.732.2767) and speak with a Red Cross representative.

Giving blood is a demonstration of our commitment to serving others in our state and nation. It is a blessing and provides another ministry opportunity for our congregation. Come out and join in the summer fun! See you at the Drive!!!
