So come...our next step in this Spirit-led journey will be coming together as a congregation on Sunday, May 5th. We need your presence, we need your voice. God's call to be the Church looks different for every congregation. It may look different even within our own community, different now than when Lord of Life first began. God's call is not passive, nor is it stagnant. By the power of the Spirit, it flows all around us and through us. It washes away that which hinders our call, and brings new opportunities to embrace our call in exciting, life-giving ways. We need you to be part of this journey, as we seek to thrive as a people of God. Will it be easy...no. Will it always be joyful...no. Yet, we are promised in scripture that in following God's call, we will experience "the Light of life," the very presence of Christ within us and shining through us. We are an imperfect, yet holy people, called by God to be a Living Church, the very Body of Christ in our world. Come, and be part of exploring this sacred call within our family of faith.


### PUT THOSE NEEDLES TO WORK!

### COUNCIL'S CORNER

#### April 1, 2019 Meeting Notes

 As voted on during January's Annual Congregational Meeting, an additional Congregational Meeting will be held after the 10:30am service on Sunday, May 5th. The main purpose of the meeting will be review church finances and to receive congregational input concerning the current leadership transition and future plans. Please plan to attend, if you are unable to attend, please share your thoughts with a member of the Council.

- Pastor Adam is to be restored from working 80% during 2019 to 100% for the next 6 months. Reasons for this decision include the fact that the need for pastoral coverage is immediate. Pastor Stacy will be gone in less than two weeks. Under the 80% position cut from January's Congregational Meeting, Pastor Adam was scheduled to be gone 3 weeks in April and May, plus 7 weeks in July and August. It is not necessarily easy to find an interim or part-time pastor who can effectively assist at Lord of Life within the short term. In addition, Pastor Adam, called as our Associate Pastor (not just a youth pastor), is willing to continue to serve as pastoral leadership for the congregation during this time of transition.
- While Council has a plan and finances will be discussed at the Congregational Meeting, we want you
  remind you that finances remain tight. Please prayerfully consider increasing your giving if you are
  able. Thank you.
- As always, please keep your Lord of Life family in your prayers. Change and transition is never easy, yet together we can move forward in God's mission for this congregation.




# 7 FROM THE PARISH NURSE

Dear friends,

Should we clap our hands together for the appearance of warmer weather and the month of May? If you applause this statement then you are right in line with this month's health observance which features 'Clap4Health!' The simple action of clapping can aid you to lead a happier, fit life! Wow! How can that be true?





Our body has over 340 acupressure points and the palm of our hand nestles 28 points in that region. When you clap your hands there is a satisfying feeling of completion, warmth and happiness. All over the country there are National Fitness Campaigns that use clapping as cardiovascular exercise as well as a way to focus and provide prevention of child and adult obesity. Clapping fuels this rich source of acupuncture points, which have direct connections to bodily organs. Clapping is a form of exercise. Let's take a look at how the 28 points of pressure in our palm can give us health assistances.

According to various acupressure, Ayurveda, and even the CDC websites, clapping can provide the following benefits:

 ${}^{\textcircled{W}}$  Clapping plays an important role in heart and lung related problems like asthma.

- ${}^{\textcircled{W}}$  Provides relief from back, neck, and joint pain.
- $^{igvee}$  You can also get relief from gout
- $^{\textcircled{W}}$  Helpful for patients of low blood pressure
- ${}^{\textcircled{W}}$  Clapping is an effective therapy for digestive disorders.
- Clapping aids skills enhancement of children and improves their academic performance. Children who clap regularly are also likely to make less spelling mistakes than their peers.
- <sup>™</sup> Clapping sharpens the brain of children.
- Clapping benefits adults. When adults engage in clapping they feel less tense and their mood improves. They also become more focused and alert.
- $^{igodold b}$  Clapping increases immunity and thus keeps diseases at bay.
- ♥ Clapping for 20-30 minutes in the morning keeps us fit and active.
- Striking both hands against each other, right to left, keeping them straight facing each other and the arms loose. Finger tips and the palm of each hand should strike each other.
- People living in air-conditioned houses and working in offices who do not sweat at all should practice clapping therapy as it would help blood circulation in the body and cleanse it fully.

Half an hour of daily clapping (Recommended:1,500 Claps per day) helps those suffering from the following:


