

I Learned Something New...

It was not long after the idea got going - in the mid-1980's - that I heard about parish nurses. It seemed like a great idea to have nurses connected to congregations, although I admit thinking that having a nurse sitting in the narthex after worship with a blood pressure cuff might be a little awkward.

All these years later, Lord of Life has given me the opportunity to learn about Parish Nursing - now often described as Faith Community Nursing. It is much more than sitting in the narthex with a blood pressure cuff! Sue Quever, the parish nurse at here at Lord of Life, has taught me much. Her work, through Advocate Aurora, is a ministry to our congregation and to our community. For folks who may be fairly new to Lord of Life, and those who may never have had the opportunity to work with Sue, I thought I would share some of what I have learned.

One part of Sue's work is fairly easy to see. Sue cares for the congregation. Her emphasis is on health - yet her work ties in with faith. I am continually amazed at how well Sue knows the people of this faith community - and how long she has known many of you. Whether tracking long-term health issues, or serving as a resource to connect people with appropriate help in the health care community, or reaching out to new moms and dads, or helping adult children find a place for aging parents, or explaining medications, or working on prevention, or walking with those who journey toward death and new life, Sue has been present to hundreds of members of the faith communities of Lord of Life, St. Mary's, and others.

There is another significant part of Sue's work that came as a surprise to me. I realized recently that Sue, our Parish Nurse, provides a large portion of the congregation's outreach to the community's and even evangelism. Do you remember the "Aurora Heart Fair" held here at church in February? Aurora Health Care professionals were here to talk about many facets of heart health, including heart disease and diabetes. Well over 60 people attended the event. A few of these were from the congregation, but the majority were from the community. At a time when Lord of Life is trying to discern new ways to reach out to the community - this is one way that it is already happening! Not only do people come for health services, they look around the building, meet some members, and recognize that this is a place where they feel God's love and feel welcome. Yea Sue and Lord of Life!

There are other ways Sue leads the congregation in outreach to the community. Whenever you hear about a class or offering - it isn't just for members of our congregation. It is for the community as well. For example, a class, Opioid Misuse Prevention, is coming up on March 23. This class will offer important information to Lord of Life, and to the larger community as well. I hope you will bring friends and family with you to this class, and that you are warm and welcoming to those who come from the community.

There are many other things Sue does as our Parish Nurse. Sue - we thank God for your ministry - for your care for us, and for the outreach to the community that you do on behalf of the congregation. May God continue to bless your faithful work!

Council Meeting Minutes February 11th 2020

Pastor's Report: Pastor Carol wanted to make sure we had a way to keep track and follow up on the goals we set at the Retreat. John said that we make it part of the agenda when we meet. Brian suggested that that we separate out the various goals to different "work teams" to do that work on the side and then to present their findings at a Council Meeting. Pastor Carol felt that we should get straight thru the operational part of the Council meeting and then spend 20 min or so on the goals part. She would like the Executive Committee to meet every 2 weeks before the Council Meeting to set the agenda. It was agreed that the Executive Committee would work on that this month before the next Council Meeting. Pastor Carol would like to start discussion on "A Door Set Open" starting next month with part one of the book. We then split up as to when we'll be attending the C3 meetings. She also went over her pastoral duties for the last month.

Financial Report: Brian went over the financial reports. Good news! We have a positive cash on hand figure. We also paid January and February's Synod benevolence. SCRIP has a \$6848.00 balance. He thought the card inventory on hand was high. Will look at that with Kris Klimisch. Income was up \$27,000 from general offerings over last month.

Administrators Report: Angie said she is still getting quotes on a new wireless system. She is also weighing the options between rechargeable batteries vs non-rechargeable batteries. Which would be more cost effective in the long run. The copier lease is up in June. She is meeting with reps for quotes for that. Also, the TDS contract is up for renewal in midsummer.

New Business: The first item is a Saturday Service time change. We are considering moving the time to 4:00PM (from the current 5:30PM) Pastor Carol stated that Kerry would be much more available if it started at 4:00 The music piece still needs work. Jackie wanted to know when this would start? Pastor Carol suggested after Easter. April 18th. Motion approved. In the ensuing discussion it was decided to table the motion to seek input from the Congregation. We could move the time and then re-evaluate in August. We'll bring it up at the next Council Meeting.

Pastor Carol would like to move the next 3 Council Meetings to the 3rd Tuesdays. No problem from anyone as to the change in dates. So that would be March 17th, April 21st, and May 19th. The Congregational Meeting will be June 28th.

The next item was a change in the constitution to have the Council term be 3 years instead of 2 years. We need to schedule a Congregational meeting for this. All agreed. There was discussion as to the logistics of the meeting for the proposal, and the Congregational meeting to facilitate the change in the constitution. We'll announce it in the Lifelines for the 30-day notification. We'll have a Congregational meeting before the 8:00 Service on march 15th. There should be enough for a quorum to put it on the slate for the Annual Congregational meeting to vote for approval. (This 3/15 meeting was postponed, as Angie would be learning more information about updating our Constitution at a workshop she would be attending on March 8th.)


We decided to put off staff reviews for a while because there is a lot on their plate right now.

Dear Friends,

In Kenosha County and all around the country, drug overdose has dramatically increased over the last two decades. Deaths from this epidemic are increasing more than 4 times between 1999 and 2017. Drug overdoses have resulted in 70,000 deaths making it a leading cause of injury-related deaths in the United States.

Did you know that of those deaths, around 68% involved a prescription or illicit opioid? The highest rates of opioid deaths are adults in the age of 25-54 years old.



In 2019, the CDC received a significant amount of money for overdose prevention and surveillance activities with most of the funds supporting state-based efforts. The 5 key strategies the CDC came up with to prevent opioid misuse, overdose, and deaths are the following:

Conduct surveillance and research

Timely data helps public health officials learn extent of problem, get resources and figure out where they are needed. CDC is researching and identifying effective strategies to prevent further opioid overdose epidemic.

• Build state, local, and tribal capacity

Run prescription drug monitoring programs, regulate controlled substances, and respond to drug overdose outbreaks

• Support providers, health systems, and payer

Health systems and providers are tracking and doing drug reviews and improving ways opioids are prescribed

• Empower consumers to make safe choices

Educate consumers about the risks of prescription opioids and the importance of safer and more effective pain management with their healthcare providers. Also CDC promotes awareness about tainted opioids with fentanyl.

• Partner with public safety

First responders are educated on how to use Narcan to save lives and if they come in contact with opioids and fentanyl. Data sharing, surveillance, and targeting intervention is also communicated with CDC, public health and law enforcement.



The CDC is getting involved with opioid prevention and taking the crisis seriously. To learn more about the opioid crisis, please attend an informal presentation Monday, March 23^{rd} at 6:30 pm - Opioid Misuse Prevention which will be offered at Lord of Life Lutheran Church -5601 Washington Road, Kenosha. Please join in the conversation and learn about opioid misuse, side effects, current trends and how to prevent misuse. Attendees will receive free information and a small gift.

RUACH, which Means BREATH in Hebrew

(Devotion from "Seven Hebrew words, every believer should know" by Dave Adamson)

We don't often think abut breathing ... unless we're running out of air. But breath is an important theme throughout the Bible. The Book of Genesis says God made man from mud and put skin, muscles, bones, blood vessels, tendons, veins and hair in place, but the man was not a "living being" until God breathed into his body.

The word for breath in Hebrew is ruach which also means Spirit, so man only becomes a "living being" when God gives him His Spirit. According to the psalms, "... everything that has breath praise the Lord", so to be alive we first inhale God's Spirit and then we exhale praise. Inhale Spirit, exhale praise. This is life.


