

Dear Friends,

The National Health Observance highlights Dental Hygiene for the month of October. The American Dental Association (ADA) stresses the value of preventive services in keeping good oral hygiene and to encourage others to develop and continue with a daily oral health routine. Brushing your teeth for two minutes at least twice a day remains a critical element to maintaining a healthy smile. Studies have shown that brushing for two minutes is perhaps the single most important step an individual can take to reduce plaque build-up and the risk of plaque-associated diseases, such as cavities and gingivitis. Flossing or using a water-pik is also an essential part of the tooth-cleaning process because it removes plaque from between teeth and at the gum line, where periodontal disease often begins. Here are a few facts I thought you would want to know:



- Oral health exams can uncover symptoms of diabetes, osteoporosis and low bone mass, eating disorders and HIV.
- Each year, millions of productive hours are lost due to dental diseases. Children missed nearly 52 million hours of school, or an average of 1.17 hours per child, in one year due to treatment problems, according to one survey. During that same time, workers lost more than 164 million work hours, an average of 1.48 hours per worker, due to lack of treatment for dental disease.
- Remember to replace your toothbrush every three to four months. Researchers have established that thousands of microbes grow on toothbrush bristles and handles. Most are harmless, but others can cause cold and flu viruses, the herpes virus that causes cold sores, and bacteria that can cause periodontal infections.
- Dental caries (cavities) is the major cause of tooth loss in children; periodontal (gum) disease is the major cause of tooth loss in adults.
- Snacking on celery, carrots, or apples helps clear away loose food and debris.
- Tongue and lip piercing can cause blood poisoning, prolonged or permanent drooling, damaged sense of taste, toxic shock syndrome, permanent damage to tooth enamel and oral tissue, and transmission of infections such as hepatitis B and HIV.
- Tobacco is the primary cause of oral cancers. Smoking a pack of cigarettes a day or using smokeless tobacco quadruples the risk of developing oral cancer
- Oral cancer occurs twice as frequently in men as women.
- The biggest oral health problem for infants is early tooth decay, known as baby-bottle tooth decay. This results when babies routinely fall asleep with bottles filled with sugary liquids such as milk, formula, and juice—anything other than plain water.
- Chewing gum can help eliminate food particles caught between teeth after a meal and also helps prevent plaque build-up by stimulating saliva production.
- Dental caries, popularly known as tooth decay, is an infectious, transmissible disease. Research shows that the presence of bacterium known as streptococcus mutans leads to dental caries in children.

Let's all share a healthy smile!
