


WHAT'S HAPPENING

When the offering basket is passed, we have the opportunity to share the abundance that God has provided.




Watch for ministry moments in worship, online, in emails, and in your postal mail and join Lord of Life as together our gifts, like God's never-ending love, make our ministries possible.



After an opening prayer, lesson, and activity, they will return to worship just in time for Communion. Sunday School will meet bi-weekly through December 11th, then after a holiday break, resume on January 15th.



7 FROM THE PARISH NURSE

Dear Friends,

The pumpkins are showing up on doorsteps along with fall decorations. A chill is in the air and the seasons are changing before our eyes. October is also the month that breast health is noted by the National Health Observance. Many women reflect on getting their mammogram for the year.

Did you know that 1 in 8 women in the United States will develop breast cancer in their lifetime. It is the most common cancer in women besides skin cancer. The National Breast Cancer Foundation reports in 2022, an estimated 287,500 new cases of invasive breast cancer will be diagnosed in U.S. woman as well as 51,400 new cases of non-invasive (In situ) breast cancer. 65% of breast cancer cases are diagnosed at a localized stage which means it has not spread outside the breast which gives a 99% survival rate in 5 years.



Although rare, men can get breast cancer too. In 2022, an estimated 2,710 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer in the U.S. and about 530 men will die of breast cancer.

The good news is that breast cancer death rates have been declining since about 1990 due to better screening, early detection, increase awareness and better treatments.

Report to your health caregiver if you notice a change in how the breast or nipple looks or feels such as tenderness or a lump in or near the breast or underarm, a change in the skin texture, some describe it to an orange peel's texture. A lump in the breast should be checked out, but not all lumps are cancerous. If you notice nipple discharge such as clear, bloody, or milky and you are not breast feeding, check it out with your doctor.

A nutritious, low-fat diet (30 grams or less) per day with plenty of fruits and green and orange vegetables can reduce the risk of developing breast cancer. A high-fat diet increases the risk because fat triggers estrogen production that can fuel tumor growth. Also exercise such as walking as little as 30 minutes per day can lower your breast cancer risk too.



Take charge of your health by performing routine breast self-exams, keep ongoing communication with your doctor, get an annual breast exam and schedule your routine screening mammogram beginning at age 40. I am praying for your health and happiness.
