


2025 will bring the 40th anniversary of Lord of Life!

We're working on a celebration to commemorate this milestone, and leading up to it we will share some history each month in our newsletter.



There is the church, there is the steeple ...

It will be five months before you can open the doors and see all the people at Lord of Life Lutheran Church. The church is being built on the southeast corner of Washington Road and Highway 31. The Rev. Jack Ottoson said the 6,500-square-foot church will 30 people in 1985 and has grown to 230.



Here's the church, but where's the steeple?

This is what is left of the steeple to the 6,500-square foot Lord of Life Lutheran Church being built on the southeast corner of Washington Road and Highway 31. An early morning storm Monday toppled the steeple and roof rafters. Kathy Ottoson, wife

of the Rev. Jack Ottoson, said this morning the congregation plans to re-start construction as soon as possible. She antici-paies the storm damage will delay completion of the church by about a month.

Dear friends,

October has gently arrived and so has the cold and flu season. There are three immunizations available this fall and winter season to help the immune system fight major respiratory viral diseases such as Covid -19, respiratory syncytial (RSV) and influenza. The Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) highlights that, based on age, pregnancy status, medical state and risk, group immunization delivers the best protection for lessening the risk of serious illness, hospitalizations, long-range complications and death. There can be vaccine side effects, but they tend to be minor and short-term.



The COVID-19 vaccine dosing is based on age, immune status and vaccine history. There are two brands that are offering the vaccine, Pfizer and Moderna at this time but Novavax will be coming soon. To protect against serious COVID illness or long COVID, ages 5 and older should receive one dose of vaccine to be current. There might be side effects from the vaccine such as a sore arm, low fever, and body aches.

RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus) is a familiar respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms. Although little babies, toddlers and elderly can really get sick and be hospitalized with this virus. We saw an uptick of cases in older adults in southeastern WI last year. Parents, grandparents and pregnant ladies need to think about a prevention plan as this virus circulates this winter. The CDC recommends a vaccine for people 75 and older and for adults ages 60-74 with chronic illnesses. Early fall is a good time to get this vaccine before the virus season begins.

The INFLUENZA vaccine is a trivalent vaccine in the U.S.A. The trivalent flu vaccine protects against three flu viruses (an A(H1N1) virus, An A(H3N2) virus, and a B/Victoria virus. People 6 months and older can get the influenza vaccine unless advised otherwise by a health care provider. A FluMist has been approved to be given, by a health care provider, as nasal spray for people 2 through 49 years of age. FluMist has the same vaccine components but does have a weakened live influenza virus.

Remember if you have a fever or influenza cold-like symptoms stay at home until you are fever free. Pull out your masks if coughing becomes an issue to prevent spreading droplets. Always cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or elbow bend when sneezing or coughing. Wash your hands often with soap and water as you sing the happy birthday song for longevity and effectiveness.
