**NOTE:** If your passport expires before September 30, 2026, then you need renew your passport before May 1, 2025 (Without old or valid passport book, Maria & Bobby's Deaf Travel would not book air, because of change names can be costly to you. As of today, the renew passport processes takes up to 4-6 weeks or more depending on the demand at the time you apply.



Norwegian sell travel protection insurance. There are two different type of travel protection insurances. Standard Plan & Platinum Plan

Standard Plan - If you need to cancel your trip for any reason and you would get about 75% of cruise penalty. Emergency Evacuation is up to \$25,000.

Platinum Plan - If you need to cancel your trip for any reason and you would get about 90% of cruise penalty. Emergency Evacuation is up to \$50,000.



Maria & Bobby's Deaf Travel sell travel protection insurance. High Recommend to purchase it for your trip package and within 21 days after your first deposit. The cost are various depends on your cost of trip & age.

Emergency Evacuation is up to \$500,000.00 for Pro Plus Plan Travel Insurance.

The Air Service Fee of round trip is \$50 (or one way of \$25) non-refundable per person. Maria & Bobby's Deaf Travel will use Flights by Norwegian Promo Air as Buy one and 2nd guest fly free — the best rates with restriction. As long as Maria & Bobby's Deaf Travel have a copy of your passport book in their file. Also, you do not need to pay the flight now and the flexibility to change flights with no change fee before final payment date due, October 10, 2025.

**NOTE:** You can book your own Air (flight) - but you need to check with your travel agent, Maria, first before you buy air tickets because Norwegian has rules about time of arrival and depart on same sailing dates and you will not be able to get Norwegian's Shuttle/Transfer unless you fly the same date as sailing date without staying hotel. **PORT OF CALLS**

**DAY 1 - Wed, March 11 ~ Lima (Callao) Peru ~ Average Temperature 61° - 75°**



Arrive in Callao, the chief port of Peru, right outside Lima to a place where fishermen in colorful boats fit right in to the picture alongside our ship. Trading routes of the 16th century saw goods from all over Peru make their way across the Andes (by mule!) to Callao, for ships headed to Spain.

**DAY 2 - Thu, March 12 ~ Trujillo (Salaverry), Peru ~ Average Temperature 65° - 80°**

We dock in the port town of Salaverry in Trujillo, a historic city on the banks of a picturesque river in the Moche Valley. While it bustles like an emerging modern city now, it was once home to the great prehistoric cultures of the Moche and Chimú.



**DAY 3 - Fri, March 13 ~ At Sea (cruising)**

**DAY 5 - Sun, March 15 ~ At Sea (cruising)**



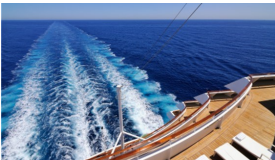

**DAY 10** - Fri, March 20 ~ Acajutla, El Salvador ~ Average Temperature 74° - 91°



Off the Pacific Coast, Acajutla is El Salvador's principal seaport. Its beautiful quiet beaches are becoming increasingly popular for their white sand, blue waters and biodiverse reefs. A short ride away is San Salvador, where guests can tour Mayan ruins, hike dormant volcanoes and visit historic churches.

**DAY 11** - Sat, March 21 ~ Puerto Quetzal, Guatemala ~ Average Temperature 71° - 90°

This port city was constructed in 1984 to help connect nearby cities. Travelers often venture out to Antigua, a 90-minute trek to where 17th century colonial facades beckons and Guatemalan history comes alive.



**DAY 12** - Sun, March 22 ~ Huatulco, Mexico ~ Average Temperature 68° - 89°



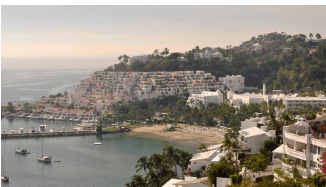

**DAY 13** - Mon, March 23 ~ Acapulco, Mexico ~ Average Temperature 72° - 87°

As one of Mexico's oldest coastal tourist destinations, Acapulco has much to offer both tourist and traveler. Shop, swim or simply take a siesta on the beach. But be sure not to miss the legendary La Quebrada cliff divers.



**DAY 14** - Tue, March 24 ~ Manzanillo, Mexico ~ Average Temperature 67° - 85°



Picturesque fishing port-turned-tourist resort and self proclaimed sail fish capital of the world. Spectacular snowcapped volcanoes offer sights rarely seen. The waters and beautiful lagoons of Manzanillo are ideal for water sports.

**DAY 15** - Wed, March 25 ~ Puerto Vallarta, Mexico ~ Average Temperature 63° - 85°

Smaller and more subdued than Acapulco, Puerto Vallarta has retained a good deal of its small village charm along with 26 miles of spectacular beaches along the Banderas Bay. Stroll the cobblestone streets to the Church of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Or peruse the many local wares for sale at the open-air markets.



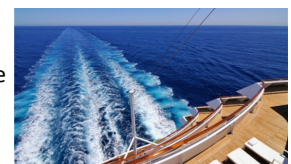
**DAY 16** - Thu, March 26 ~ Cabo San Lucas, Mexico ~ Average Temperature 56° - 83°



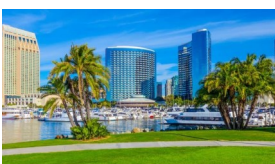
