Pre-Installation (continued)

REMOVING THE TOP AND SINK(S) -requires at least two people

- 1. Carefully begin to lift the top with sink(s)
- 2. The top must be lifted and set down gently, at an angle and never carried flat
- 3. Gently set the top, sink side down on a soft surface
- 4. Remove the black foam strip from the top of the cabinet frame
- 5. Gently remove any residue


Planning Installation

DETERMINING WALL PLACEMENT

- Determine the position of the vanity cabinet prior to installation. Verify location of plumbing relative to existing allowances in the vanity cabinet.
 - A1 Allowance for drain and water supply
 - A2 Allowance for P-trap
- Available plumbing cutouts can be found on the back and under side of the vanity cabinet.







ELECTRICAL OUTLET SPECIFICATIONS

WALL OUTLET




NOTE: Prior to installing the vanity, ensure location of wall outlet is in line with the plug from the integrated electrical box once fed through the back panel in the provided opening (1).



CAUTION: For your safety and to achieve the best possible installation of this cabinet, we recommend you consult with a professional contractor for electrical outlet placements and specifications.

- □ Use a pencil to mark the desired location for the two
- Place cord clamps (CC) around cord.
- Attach the cord clamps (CC) to the wall using screws (GG)






NOTE: Cord length for the integrated electrical device is 6 ft. 6 in. (201 cm)


Locating French cleats

 Locate the pair of French cleats (FF) on the back of the vanity cabinet (A) and remove the cleat with the mounting holes on the bottom. The remaining cleat should have the mounting holes at the top.




2 Determine mounting type

For Wall Mount, move to step 3.




□ For Floor Standing, move to step 4.



3 Preparing the vanity for wall mounting

- Place blanket or other soft material on the floor and place the vanity on the soft surface.
- □ Remove the metal base (B) from the vanity cabinet (A) by removing the 1/4 x 1-1/4 in. bolts (BB) using the hex wrench (AA).

Preparing for French cleat installation




WARNING: Before cutting, drilling, or hammering into any wall surface, verify the location of electrical, plumbing, and gas lines. Cutting any of these may cause serious injury.



NOTE: If you are unable to use wall studs, use drywall anchors (EE). Use a 3/16 in. drill bit to drill pilot holes into the marked locations. Screw anchors into the holes, turning clockwise until flush with the wall.

- Carefully place the vanity cabinet (A) against the wall in the desired location and mark a center line (1) on the wall with a pencil.
- Remove the vanity cabinet (A) from the wall until ready for installation.
- □ Draw a horizontal line 29-1/8 in. from the floor, across the center line (2).
- Moving left and right of the center line (1), along the horizontal line (2) locate the wall studs.
- Place the French cleat (FF) along the horizontal line (2), as shown, and mark the holes on the wall with a pencil.
- Drill holes in each marked location with a depth no less than 1/2 in.




Attaching the Vanity to the Wall

Attaching the French cleat to the wall





□ Attach the French cleat (FF) to the wall using the screws (DD).



2 Securing the vanity to the wall with the French cleat

□ Using two people, lift the vanity cabinet (A) so the French cleat (FF) on the back of the vanity slides over and rests on the French cleat (FF) on the wall.



Installing the Top with Sink

- □ Align and secure the quartz top (C) to the vanity cabinet (A) using a high-quality adhesive and caulk gun.
- □ Allow adhesive to dry in accordance with manufacturer's instruction before installing plumbing and using the vanity.
