A MINISTRY OF COMPASSION

Matthew 9:35-37

In Matthew 9:35-37 Jesus was moved by the spiritual conditions of the people. They were helpless, confused and without a leader. Compassion moved Jesus to come and to call sinners to repentance. The misery of a dying servant, a grieving widow, a spiritual misunderstanding or even a penitent sinner, Jesus helped them all because compassion does not judge: it ministers (Luke 5:31-32; 7). Jesus gave Himself for us through His compassion, for the least deserving. He looked beyond our faults (Romans 5:8)—beyond our attitudes, beyond our sins for ways to serve, to honor God, and ways to give non-Him, then it becomes our journey too. The journey to heaven is to travel on the Christians a hope of life in the Kingdom of God.

Jesus was committed to the Kingdom of God and why would our with compassion. commitment to Him be anything less. When we are committed to Christ, we show that we are recipients of God's compassion and grace. Paul wrote in Galatians 3:27-28; "we are all children of God by faith in Christ Jesus, for all who have been baptized into Christ have put on Christ (have clothed yourselves

in Christ)." Every person saved by Christ is added to the body of Christ, to live a resurrected and renewed life (2 Corinthians 5:17) because we received His compassion. We know what it feels like to be loved by Jesus.

Secondly, we represent the mercy or compassion we received. To "re -present", means to present again. 1 Peter 3:14-17—"but even if you suffer for doing what is right, God will reward you for it. So don't be afraid and don't worry. Instead you must worship Christ as Lord of your life. And if you are asked about your Christian hope always be ready to explain it." Everyone in Christ, is commissioned to model and declare their experience of compassion received, and to offer to anyone the life that is the Kingdom of God.

This was the Lord's journey in the world, if we are committed to road of compassion. When Jesus saw the need, He sent His disciples to meet it




