RULES FOR OPEN LIVESTOCK:

1. Due to weight variances, entries should be made by division only. Animals will be classified by class in accordance with instructions in Local Rules. All animals in each entry must be owned by one exhibitor.
2. No premium award will be paid on any animal that does not meet the weight requirements of the class.
3. Animals entered in all divisions must arrive on the grounds WEDNESDAY, JULY 24, 2024, in time to be Vet Checked between 2:00 – 5:00 p.m. and weighed in at 5:00 pm. All female cattle must comply with bangs vaccination per State Regulation.
4. ***Clipping and grooming of animals is prohibited***, so as to maintain their ***true range*** appearance.
5. Heifer is an animal under three years of age that has not calved.
6. By his/her signature as the owner or agent on an entry form, the exhibitor also certifies that the sire of each animal, entered in the following classes for grade animals, was either registered or purebred.

ANYTHING OTHER THAN STRAW OR SHAVINGS IS PROHIBITED FOR LIVESTOCK BEDDING

JUNIOR EXHIBITORS & JUNIOR ORGANIZATIONS MAY BE ALLOWED TO ENTER EXHIBITS IN SENIOR DEPARTMENT CLASSES FOR WHICH THEY ARE ELIGIBLE ONLY WHEN IT ALLOWS PARTICIPATION IN FEATURED BREED AND/OR SPONSORED ASSOCIATION SHOWS. THE JUNIOR EXHIBITOR MUST ALSO EXHIBIT THE PROJECT IN THE JUNIOR DIVISION.

JUDGING RULES: Rules, definitions and judging procedure as prescribed in the latest edition of the Official Show Rules and Standard of Perfections of the American Poultry Association, Inc., shall apply to all district and county fair poultry shows, except in such instances where they conflict with rules and regulations prescribed by the Department of Food & Agriculture. Birds will be judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. If no class is offered no award may be made. ALL ENTRIES ARE FINAL - NO SUBSTITUTIONS. Disqualified birds and those absent at the time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the section. A judge may excuse a bird from competition if it appears to be fatigued or out of condition, but the bird shall be counted as an entry. For all classes of Standard bred chickens, all birds must be identified by leg bands conforming to the entry form on arrival at the show.

HEALTH RULES: refer to State Rules and scorecards for California Fairs. Any bird showing evidence of disease will be immediately removed from the fairgrounds. HEALTH INSPECTION REQUIRED UPON ARRIVAL. (SEE SCHEDULE) ANY VIOLATION OF STATE OR LOCAL RULES WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF ANY AWARDS. STATE RULES APPLY.

RABBIT RULES

Rabbit Rules:

1. No Exhibitor may dictate to management the conditions under which he/she shall exhibit. **All judging will be done following the A.R.B.A. Rules unless they conflict with California State Fair Rules. ALL RABBIT EXHIBITORS MUST EXHIBIT AT LEAST ONE OR MORE RABBITS FOR THE DURATION OF FAIR as space allows.** Management will assign pens. All Rabbits shall remain for the Exhibitor's Show of Champions.
2. Substitutions may be made only within the same breed, variety, sex and age (class) as the animal being withdrawn and must be made no later than one hour prior to judging.
3. All animals must be identified by permanent Ear Tattoo conforming to the entry form on arrival of the show. Any duplication of ear markings by one exhibitor in the same division must be eliminated and the change recorded on the judging sheet before judging takes place.
4. Rabbits must be entered by breed, variety, sex, ear tattoo, age in month (class) and in the correct division and class with required owner's and leader's signatures to be considered a valid entry.
5. Animals will be shown and judged in the proper division and class for breed, variety, age and sex only. Rabbits that are disqualified because of permanent defects, deformities or blemishes, and those absent at time of judging do not count when computing the number of exhibitors in the class.

STALL DISPLAY CONTEST

This contest provides exhibitors with an opportunity to acquaint the public with their projects. The displays will be judged on the overall appearance of an exhibitor's animal exhibit, including photos, displays, posters, decorations and information about the animal.

Photos must include the exhibitor and livestock animal project. Photos may show what has been learned, activities participated in, how to do something related to the project, or a posed photo of the livestock, with or without the exhibitor.

Display must not be over 4' x 4' for large animals (cattle, sheep, swine, goats) and not over 11" x 17" for small animals (poultry, rabbits). Displays to be placed in same area as livestock and out of livestock's reach.

HERDSMANSHIP AWARD

DIVISION 119 – HERDSMANSHIP COMPETITION

\$100 cash award Sponsored by *Simmons Landscape Company – Chad & Erika Simmons*

The Herdsmanship competition is designed to encourage Clubs to maintain their exhibits at the highest standard of efficiency and attractiveness throughout the period of the Junior Livestock Show. The time of this competition will be from 9:00 am, Wednesday, of the Fair to 5:00 pm, Saturday, of the Fair and will be judged daily during this time. This competition may be judged at any time between the hours of 9:00 am to 5:00 pm daily. Should it be necessary to have all stalls judged after 5:00 pm, individual clubs will not lose courtesy points due to member absence. Herdsmanship Competition must be carried out without adult assistance. All Chapters and Clubs are automatically entered.

BASIS OF SCORING:

- A. CLUB/EXHIBITOR DISPLAY35 points
Each club is required to be identified by appropriate signage and/or stall cards. Further decoration is not essential, but displays should be neat and tell about their exhibits. Fire regulations forbid the use of crepe paper streamers in decorations.
- B. STALLS & EQUIPMENT.....20 points
Adequate bedding, cleanliness, neatness, and tidiness of pens are expected. Boxes kept tidy and out of alleyways, supplies kept neat and orderly.
- C. ANIMALS20 points
Animals tied properly, kept clean and well-groomed with proper amounts of food & water at all times.
- D. EXHIBITORS.....25 points
Club members should display courtesy and politeness to the public at all times. Members should be attentive, neat in appearance, handle their animals well, and their conduct courteous and above reproach.

INTER – CLUB COMPETITION

Cash Award sponsored by the Manassero Family

An award will be presented to the highest overall participant by a 4-H or Grange Club at the Amador County Fair. The goal of this award is to increase participation, sense of competition and gain a unity within the 4-H and Grange Clubs during the Amador County Fair.

Awards are based on a point system for all placings in 4-H & Grange divisions in the premium book, excluding gardens. The number of points is divided by the number of members in their respective club, multiplied by the percentage of enrollment participating in the Fair. Only clubs which have submitted rosters will be eligible.

The club/chapter rosters submitted as of Friday, June 2, 2023, will be the basis for scoring.

The award will consist of a perpetual trophy with the club's name engraved upon it. The winning club will receive an individual trophy for display, which will be presented at the Junior Livestock Auction.
