## PRESERVED AND DRIED FOODS RULES:

1. All preserved and dried entries must be home prepared and canned or packed by the exhibitor within one year of the opening date of the Fair.
2. Each entry shall consist of one (1) standard canning jar (designed specifically for canning purposes).
3. New lids and rings shall be used.
4. Glass topped containers, such as Weck canning jars or Tattler Reusable Canning Lids are accepted.
5. Fruits, vegetables and pickles may be in $4 \mathrm{oz} ., 1 / 2$ pint (recommended) or quart jars.
6. James, jellies, preserves or marmalades may be in half pint (recommended) or pint jars.
7. No paraffin seals.
8. All jars must be sealed unless otherwise allowed.
9. Preserved entry shall be labeled securely on the TOP of the jar and specify the product, date of preservation and the canning method used (for example: apricot jam, pectin method, boiling-water bath). The exhibitor's name shall NOT be visible on the label or jar.
10. Dried entry shall be packed in airtight jar labeled securely on the BOTTOM of the jar and specify the variety of fruit, vegetable, meat, seasoning and method used in preparation (for example: dehydrator, oven, sun sulphured, etc.), and date of preservation.
11. All products will be opened.
12. Each entry shall be a different product or different method (for example: water bath vs. pressure canning).
13. No refrigerated entries shall be accepted.
14. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR PRESERVED FOODS

- All low-acid foods (all vegetables, meats, poultry and fish) must be canned under pressure
- Low-acid fruit, such as figs, must include added lemon juice.
- High-acid foods, including acidified tomatoes, fruits, pickles and relishes, may be canned in boiling-water bath or steam canner.
- Open-kettle, inversion, over or microwave methods of canning shall NOT be accepted
- Dried meats, including jerky, shall include recipe stating temperature used to dry meats. USDA requires dried meats must reach 165 degrees to be safe.

9. An herb entry consists of six (6) healthy, clean, pest-free sprigs at least 6 " long in fresh water. Sprigs will be bundled together at the cut end with an appropriately sized rubber band. Cut ends that will be submerged in water should be cleaned of leaves.
10. Entry should be submitted on a plate appropriate for the size of the entry. Use a small, rimmed plate or bowl for a cherry tomato entry, for example, and perhaps a shallow basket for a zucchini entry.

G. Silent auction bids will be accepted concurrent with the Junior Livestock Auction. Highest bidder will be contacted for payment and pick uparrangements.
H. All exhibitors selling an item in the Farm \& Home Equipment Silent Auction will be assessed a charge of $7 \%$ of the gross selling price to defray auction sale expenses.
