<u>Livestock Office Hours</u>: Tuesday thru Saturday 7:00 am to 7:00 pm Sunday 8:00 am to 6:00 pm

1. <u>ALL STATE AND HEALTH RULES:</u> All State and Health Rules apply to the Sr. and Jr. Departments.

2. <u>All Junior Livestock Exhibitors need to have a valid</u> <u>Quality Assurance Certificate on file at the Fair Office.</u> To be turned in no later than the exhibitor's respective specie Pre-Weigh-In/Declaration date for all Livestock animals, including breeding projects. <u>http://yqca.org/</u>

(Horse & Primary exhibitors are exempt).

3. <u>ANIMALS</u> affected by or having been exposed to any contagious diseases, during the thirty days preceding the Fair will be excluded from the grounds. In case of any outbreak of contagious or infectious diseases among the domestic animals, neither the Amador County Fair Board nor employees will be liable for any damage or loss to exhibitors.

4. <u>STALL ASSIGNMENTS</u> and pens assignments will not be made until club/chapter leaders/advisors review and verify all entries. Stall assignments will be made by the fair.

5. <u>LIABILITY FOR STALL DAMAGES</u>: a charge for damage to any stalls, which includes removal of stall boards, will be billed to the exhibitor. Failure to make payment shall prohibit the exhibitor or his/her horses or his/her livestock from making future entries at the Amador County Fair. In the event the exhibitor has won premium awards, replacement costs will be deducted from said premiums.

6. EXHIBITORS WILL BE EXPECTED TO KEEP STALLS CLEAN, and aisles swept down. All manure and debris must be removed to outside of the barns daily. Removal time shall be prior to 7:00 A.M. each day. Please do not remove debris at times other than allotted. Trash containers are located throughout the barns to use for paper, cans, etc. We encourage the use of these containers in the effort to keep our barns as clean as possible. ALWAYS RECYCLE WHEN POSSIBLE.

7. NO LIVESTOCK will be allowed on the grounds prior to Tuesday, of Fair at 6:00 am.

8. JUDGING SCHEDULES: It will be each exhibitor's responsibility to follow the progress of judging schedules & to be prepared and ready to enter the judging ring promptly when classes are called. At Judges discretion, continuation into the next specie may start prior to listed breaks if time allows i.e. *"To Follow"*. Be Ready!! Exhibitors having more than one animal to show must arrange to exchange animals without delay. CLASSES WILL NOT BE HELD FOR LATE EXHIBITORS. All animals entered in groups must be of one breed.

9. NO "FOR SALE" SIGNS will be permitted or placed upon any exhibit or in any building of the Amador County Fair. There is no objection to private sales, but in case a sale is made, no sign announcing the sale may be placed in or upon any building or exhibit.

10. <u>NO DOGS OR PETS ARE ALLOWED ON</u> <u>FAIRGROUNDS</u> except those entered in Fair as exhibits and service animals. 11. <u>OTHER CURRENT AMADOR COUNTY FAIR JUNIOR</u> <u>LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS ARE</u> responsible for care of their own animals, which includes feeding, pen cleaning, grooming and/or shearing. Assistance and/or instruction may be offered <u>ONLY</u> by other Amador County Fair junior exhibitors, and while the exhibitor is present. Adults may offer <u>ONLY</u> verbal assistance and/or instruction. Any exception must be approved in advance and in writing by the Livestock Superintendent. 12. <u>WAIVERS:</u> All exhibitors are required to sign a "Release & Waiver of Liability Agreement" to exhibit in the Livestock & Horse shows. Exhibitors under the age of 18 years also require a parent or guardian signature.

13. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS: The Amador County Fair would like to make you aware as an exhibitor there is <u>NO</u> liability coverage provided on your behalf, in the event that your animal/exhibit would cause bodily injury or property damage. It is strongly recommended that you check with your insurance agent or insurance company to see if your present liability extends to you while participating as an exhibitor at the Amador County Fair. Special events insurance is available through the California Fair Services Authority (CFSA). Contact the Fair Entry office for rates.

14. INDEPENDENT EXHIBITORS shall provide insurance coverage as required by the Fair. Special events insurance is available through the California Fair Services Authority (CFSA). Contact the Fair Entry office for rates. NOTE: Beef and Horse declarations due by March 26, 2022. (120 days prior to Fair). Horse Leases must be submitted by March 26, 2022, as well. All other Livestock declarations must be made bv May 21, 2022 (at least 60 days prior to Fair) but at the conclusion of specific species Pre-Weigh-In.

15. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES MAY RESULT IN THE DISQUALIFICATION OF THE EXHIBITOR WITH LOSS TO ANY & ALL PREMIUMS!

16. PREG-CHECK, PRE-WEIGH IN & DECLARATIONS: Replacement Heifers & Market Beef on March 26, 2022. Lambs, Swine, Goats, Poultry & Rabbits on May 21, 2022. <u>All Market Beef</u>, must show a minimum gain of 20% over the pre-weigh in weight at the time of Fair Weigh-in. **Tuesday**, July 26th. All Market Animals must meet the Fair's requirements for market classes.

17. LOCAL BRED ANIMALS: All exhibitors wishing to show in the "Local Bred" class(es) are required to submit completed "Local Bred" paperwork at Species designated Pre-Weigh-In date. **No Exceptions**

18. <u>GOATS</u>: This is a **NO BUCK** Show for <u>ALL</u> goats. ALL market goats must be dehorned or tipped.

19. VET CHECK: Is required for all Livestock animals entered. **Jr. Livestock** – will be upon entering the fairgrounds on Tuesday, of Fair. A vet check card will be issued and will be needed in order to come across the scale for weigh in. **Sr. Livestock** – will have Vet check On Wednesday, July 27th, after 3:00 pm. **ALL OPEN EXHOBITORS** <u>must be</u> present for Vet Check. Any animal assessed unfit shall leave the grounds **IMMEDIATELY!**

LIVESTOCK RULES

20. <u>MEDICAL RELEASE:</u> Medical release forms are required for each potential sale terminal animal that would be harvested for consumption. All medical release forms (Market Goat Market Sheep, Market Swine) need to be signed & turned in during Tuesday of Fair, at Weigh-In. Turn in medical release forms for Turkeys & Market Poultry to the Livestock office Tuesday of Fair, after judging. Steers & Market Heifers turn in medical release forms on Wednesday of Fair, at Weigh-In for Market Beef. Turn in medical release forms for Rabbits to the Livestock office Wednesday of Fair, after judging.

21. <u>ABSOLUTELY</u> NO LIVESTOCK IS ALLOWED OUTSIDE OF THE BARN AREA AT ANY TIME FOR ANY REASON! NOR ARE THEY ALLOWED IN THE CAMPING AREA FOR ANY REASON!
22. <u>MANDATORY</u> <u>MEETING</u>: All Junior Livestock

22. <u>MANDATORY MEETING:</u> All Junior Livestock Exhibitors, Leaders and at least one (1) parent shall attend the Mandatory Meeting Tuesday of Fair at 3:00 p.m.

23. <u>WEIGH-IN & PREG CHECK:</u> Weigh in for Swine shall be from 6:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday of Fair as they are unloaded from their trailers after Vet check. Overweight hogs will be immediately excused from the Fair. Weigh-In for Market Goats & Market Sheep will follow the Mandatory Meeting. <u>NEW</u> Weigh-In for Replacement Heifer and Market Beef exhibitors will be on **Wednesday, July 27, 2022, 8:00 a.m.** Must have Bill of Sale and Transportation Slip to present to Brand Inspector.

24. <u>CODE OF CONDUCT & ETHICS</u>: All exhibitors will adhere to both their associated organizational Code of Conduct and Ethics as well as those of the Amador County Fair. Any adults associated with an exhibitor(s), projects or animals will encourage compliance nor allow conduct/rule violations. Expectations include:

- **a.** No obscene language.
- **b.** No tobacco, e-cigarette, or marijuana use.
- **c.** No drinking of alcoholic beverages by minors as defined by local ordinance and State law(s).
- **d.** No use or possession of other illegal substances or products.
- **e.** Use of appropriate language and manner towards other people. Abusive/threatening language will not be tolerated.
- **f.** Appropriate treatment of animals. Any cruel or abusive treatment toward an animal will not be tolerated.
- **g.** Exhibitors shall conduct themselves in a professional manner in the livestock area, including, but not limited to, appropriate dress, physical contact **and language**.

25. <u>NO LAMBS OR GOATS IN THE HORSE BARNS,</u> BEEF BARNS OR BEEF FITTING AREA!

26. "<u>MOVE OUT</u>": No stall/display tear downs or equipment removal is allowed until after 6:00 pm on Sunday. No Livestock is allowed to leave until after 6:00 pm or the Livestock Transport(s) have been loaded and are gone to ensure animal safety and safety of livestock staff and volunteers. Leaders and Advisors are expected to enforce this rule. Any vehicles that inhibit/block alleyway areas or otherwise impede necessary roadways will be towed at the owner's expense. Sr./Open Livestock may haul out prior to Sunday. morning with a Livestock Release. Exhibitors are **required** to clean their pens and tie area before leaving fairgrounds. No open livestock will be released on Sunday until after 6:00 pm. Absolutely no vehicles down alley ways until transport truck is gone.

SCRAPIE REQUIREMENTS FOR GOATS & SHEEP

- **1.** All sheep and goats entering fairs require individual identification. All official ID will be kept on the animals. The official ID may be official USDA individual ID ear tags, premises ear tags, Scrapie Flock Certification Program ear tags, registration tattoos, if accompanied by registration papers, or other methods approved by the CA Department of Food & Ag.
- **2.** All sheep and goats from out of state require official individual identification, a certificate of veterinary inspection and a California entry permit.
- **3.** Fairs will not accept sheep and goats from scrapie "noncompliant" flocks, or animals that are scrapie-positive or scrapie suspects.
- **4.** Fairs will not accept sheep and goats from scrapieinfected or source flocks, or animals that have been exposed to scrapies unless they have been evaluated and approved for exhibition by the State scrapie epidemiologist.
- **5.** Fairs will keep records of the consignor, buyer, and animal identification for five (5) years when animals change ownership at the fair.
- **6.** Fairs will try to accommodate Scrapie Flock Certification Program members with separate space, if practical. Breeding animals should be housed in separate enclosures or locations from animals that aren't in the certification program, if practical.
- **7.** Sheep or goats within 30 days pre- or post-parturition, or with vaginal discharge, shall if practical, be kept separate from animals from different flocks and in an area that can be properly cleaned and disinfected.
- **8.** It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to acquire scrapie identification before fair.
- **9.** Sheep and/or Goats not having scrapies tags at preweigh in will not be allowed across the scales and will not be accepted after scales close.

LIVESTOCK AUCTION, REPLACEMENT HEIFER SALE & AGRICULTURAL MECHANICS SILENT AUCTION.

Limited to Amador County 4-H Clubs, FFA Chapters, Youth Granges & Independent exhibitors attending schools or living in Amador County meeting the Junior Department State Rules for California Fairs exhibitor requirements.

LARGE ANIMALS BEEF, SWINE, LAMB & MEAT GOATS

ALL ELIGIBLE CHAMPIONS AND RESERVE CHAMPIONS AND "SALE CHAMPION" AND "SALE RESERVE CHAMPION" ARE REQUIRED TO SELL. If the exhibitor of the Champion or Reserve Champion is not eligible to sell, the judge will choose a "Sale Champion". Only Beef, Swine, Lambs, and Meat Goats graded as Marketable One (1) or Marketable Two (2) will be allowed to sell in the auction.

Sellers may sell only one (1) large animal (Beef, Swine, Lambs, & Meat Goat) subject to the following exceptions:

~If Seller has more than one Marketable One (1) Swine, Lambs, or Meat Goat, seller may sell a maximum of two large animals.

~If Seller has a Marketable One (1) or Marketable Two (2) Beef **AND** a Marketable One (1) Swine, Lambs or Meat Goat, seller may sell Beef and one other Marketable One (1) animal.

~If Seller has two or more Champion or Reserve Champion large animals, all Champions will sell, but seller may not sell any other Marketable large animals.

<u>SMALL ANIMALS</u> RABBITS, POULTRY & TURKEYS

Only Champion & Reserve Champion will sell.

THE AMADOR COUNTY FAIR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

1. Livestock sold in the Auction must be exhibited in one of the market classes of beef, lamb, swine, meat goat, rabbit, turkey, or poultry in the current year's Amador County Fair.

2. <u>No</u> personal information about the seller will be given out by the auctioneers during the auction.

3. <u>All market animals must have been Weighed-In or</u> <u>declared with their "Intent to Show & Sell" on species</u> <u>Pre-Weigh-In date.</u> The Fair must have marked and/or weighed all market livestock animals, except rabbits and poultry, on species Pre-Weigh-in dates.

4. 4-H & Grange leaders, FFA advisors, and Independent exhibitor's parent or guardian will submit to the Amador County Fair the names of exhibitors owning fryer rabbits, meat pen rabbits, and poultry and the identification numbers of their rabbits and poultry by the May 21, 2022 declaration date. Rabbits & poultry whose identification numbers have not been received by this date will not be eligible for sale.

5. There will be **NO** substitutions of any animal due to death, loss or for any other reason following Pre-Fair Weigh-In of large animals and official declarations of intent to exhibit small animals. (Exception: See Replacement Heifer Rules) Pre-Weigh-In for **Beef** on **March 26, 2022** and Swine, Lambs, & Goats on **May 21, 2022.** There is no maximum pre-weigh weight for beef, lambs, or goats. <u>All Market animals</u> must meet minimum and not exceed the maximum weight at the time of Fair weigh-in on **Tuesday, July 26, 2022**, and meet the Fair's requirements for market classes. <u>Sheep and/or Goats not having scrapies tags at Pre-Weigh-In/Declaration will not be allowed across the scales and will not be accepted after scales close</u>.

6. Animals must meet the specified weight and classification given in the premium list for the particular divisions. Animals will be weighed in at the specific time listed in the Livestock Schedule, after arrival at the fairgrounds.

7. There will be one weigh-in only per species. If the animal does not make weight, upon request, the animal will be taken off the scale, the scale balanced, and the animal immediately re-weighed. Sellers do not receive any payment for any weight that exceeds: 155 lbs. for lambs; 1300 lbs. for beef steers and 1200 lbs. for market beef heifers; 105 lbs. for market goats. Swine exceeding 285 lbs. will be disqualified and must leave the fairgrounds on completion of weigh-in.

8. **DECLARATIONS:** EXHIBITOR/SELLER MUST make a declaration of intent to sell for ALL sale animals NO LATER THAN one (1) hour after the end of the last Junior Market Show. Replacement Heifers, declaration of intent to sell must be made within 10 minutes of end of heifer show. Failure to declare will result in a penalty of \$75.00 per animal for reinstatement into the sale order. For Replacement Heifers, the fee must be paid by Friday, prior to the sale. For market animals, the fee must be paid by 11am Saturday prior to the Livestock Auction. Declarations, payment and reinstatement into the sale order will NOT be accepted after Saturday at 11 am. **NO EXCEPTIONS**. Excess declarations made by a seller will be corrected at the discretion of the Fair.

9. DECLARATION PHOTOS: Seller must submit a digital show ready photograph of the full profile of the animal including exhibitor in uniform, due to the fairs show secretary on the Tuesday, two (2) weeks prior to the "Tuesday" of fair.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

10. Animals must be withheld from sale if any medications have been administered to those animals other than in accordance with label instructions.

11. Animals may be withheld from the sale for health reasons at the discretion of the Fair.

12. Sale order will be posted in the livestock barns **Friday evening**. The Fair reserves the right to arrange the sale order in the manner in which they consider equitable to all sellers.

13. Appearance of Exhibitor & Animal: The Exhibitor shall wear approved organization's (i.e. 4-H, Jr. Grange, FFA) uniform and Independent Exhibitors shall wear a white collared shirt and white or dark pants/jeans. All exhibitors will have closed toes shoes while in the ring. Animals shall enter sale ring in show ready. Only show products allowed by Fair Management may be used. No Glitter!!

14. Seller is responsible for bringing own animal into sale ring in **accordance with the sale order** and then to a designated location.

15. Each animal will be sold to the highest bidder without reserve. The auctioneer will settle any disputes as to bids by declaring all bids off and reselling the animal in question. Bidding procedure will accept buying orders as allowable bids.

16. <u>**THIS IS A TERMINAL SALE.**</u> ANIMALS sold at this auction will be transported to the USDA approved processing facility contracted with by the Amador County Fair. The Fair will provide transportation. The split carcass (with the exception of the resale animals) will be returned to the processing plant of the purchaser's choice of options available for that year's

Livestock Auction listed in the auction Sale Catalog and sales slip. Animals consigned for sale and sold through the auction are not eligible for re-purchase.

17. All animals large and small will be at purchaser's risk as sold and will be delivered to the livestock transport for shipment at the completion of the sale.

18. Animals may be sold one (1) time *only*.

19. All animals will be cared for, free of charge and without responsibility to the buyer, until shipped. Swine exhibitors are required to supply feed and ensure water is available to their animals until transport truck arrives Monday a.m. after Fair.

20. PRIVATE TREATY SALE ANIMALS: <u>Contingent</u> <u>upon space availability</u> in livestock transport, <u>Private</u> <u>Treaty Sale Animals</u> will be accepted for processing on a first come, first served basis. Prior to being accepted on the wait list for processing, written verification of sale on Fair Forms must be completed and submitted to the Livestock Office with payment of appropriate fees by end of the Junior Livestock Auction. Only those animals eligible for sale through the auction are allowed to be sold through the Fair Private Treaty (No Feeders or Fatties).

21. <u>AGRICULTURAL MECHANICS SILENT AUCTION:</u> All exhibits eligible to sell through the silent auction will be in place by 9:00 a.m. Sunday at the designated area. Minimum bids will be set by the exhibitor with increments of \$20.00. Bids will be taken until 1:30 p.m. Exhibits will sell to the highest bidder and are subject to all Junior Livestock Auction Rules and Policies. Exhibitors must remain near their silent auction lot to answer questions as needed.

AMADOR COUNTY FAIR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION POLICIES

22. Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Exhibitor (Seller) Policy for Replacement Heifers, Terminal Livestock & Agricultural Mechanic's: Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction (JLA) disbursements for all fair JLA Exhibitor (seller) will be distributed at the time the Amador County Fair has received enough monies to fund all exhibitor (seller) payments, or within 90 days of the auction, whichever occurs first. Sellers will be paid by check. A commission of seven percent (7%) of the gross selling price will be deducted to defray auction sale expenses and provide improvements to the Junior Livestock Program. Any legally mandated inspection/marketing fees will also be deducted.

23. Amador County Fair Junior Livestock Auction Buyer Policy

- A. All buyers are required to provide credit card information or guarantee of payment (signed check) prior to receiving a buyer's number. <u>EXCEPTIONS MUST BE APPROVED IN ADVANCE BY AMADOR COUNTY FAIR BOARD OF</u> <u>DIRECTORS OR ITS DESIGNEE</u>.
- B. All buyers at the Amador County Junior Livestock Auction (JLA) must have received a buyer's number and provided required contact and payment information prior to purchasing an animal. *Any lot sold to a buyer without a buyer's number will be considered a "no sale" and will be sold immediately.*
- C. All buyers are expected to pay for their purchases on the day of the Auction. Cash, Check, Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express are accepted forms of payment. A 3% credit card fee will be added to <u>ALL</u> credit card purchases. An additional fee of \$35 shall be assessed on all insufficient fund checks and/or transaction fees resulting from a declined check or credit card transaction.
- D. Should the JLA lot not be paid the day of the sale, the payment guarantee will be utilized for any outstanding balances after 30 days of the auction. It is the responsibility of the buyer to ensure all outstanding balances are paid within 30 days of auction.
- E. At 30 days, any outstanding balances and fees will accrue a twenty (20%) percent penalty, compounded monthly, until the balance is paid in full.
- F. The Amador County Fair JLA reserves the right to refuse to issue a buyer's number to any potential buyer due to their prior non-payment or poor payment history.

All sale declarations are to be made within **10 minutes** after the Replacement Heifer show. Failure to declare will result in a penalty of \$75 per animal for reinstatement into the sale order. For Replacement Heifers, the fee must be paid by **Friday**, prior to the sale.

Project Agreement forms must be completed by each exhibitor intending to show a replacement heifer at the Amador County Fair; All rules & regulations must be adhered to refer to annual Amador County Fair Replacement Heifer Packet.

Heifers must be bred to calve between Sept 1st and Oct 31st of the fair year. Heifers that calve prior to or during the Amador County Fair Beef Replacement Heifer show will be disqualified and ineligible to show or sell through the Beef Replacement Heifer show and sale.

Replacement Heifers will be pregnancy tested on Wednesday of Fair, time and location to be announced at the mandatory exhibitor meeting on Tuesday. At that time, exhibitors will be required to submit a Medication Form with all other required documents.

Replacement Heifer projects can be entered and shown in the Beef Showmanship on the Friday of Fair. See Livestock schedule for date and time.

All replacement heifer project exhibitors must have brand inspection documents available at weigh-in and final pregnancy check on Wednesday, July 27, 2022.

The Herdsmanship competition is designed to encourage Clubs to maintain their exhibits at the highest standard of efficiency and attractiveness throughout the period of the Junior Livestock Show. The time of this competition will be from 9:00 am, Wednesday, of the Fair to 5:00 pm, Saturday, of the Fair and will be judged daily during this time. This competition may be judged at any time between the hours of 9:00 am to 5:00 pm daily. Should it be necessary to have all stalls judged after 5:00 pm, individual clubs will not lose courtesy points due to member absence. Herdsmanship Competition must be carried out without adult assistance. All Chapters and Clubs are automatically entered.

BASIS OF SCORING:

- Adequate bedding, cleanliness, neatness and tidiness are expected.
- Animals tied properly, kept clean and well groomed at all times.
- D. EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES25 points Boxes kept tidy and out of alleyways, supplies kept neat and orderly.

INTER – CLUB COMPETITION

Cash Award sponsored by the Manassero Family

An award will be presented to the highest overall participant by a 4-H or Grange Club at the Amador County Fair. The goal of this award is to increase the participation, sense of competition and gain a unity within the 4-H and Grange Clubs during the Amador County Fair.

Awards are based on a point system for all placings in 4-H & Grange divisions in the premium book, excluding gardens. The number of points is divided by the number of members in their respective club, multiplied by the percentage of enrollment participating in the Fair. Only clubs, which have submitted rosters, will be eligible.

The club/chapter rosters submitted as of Friday, June 3, 2022, will be the basis for scoring.

The award will consist of a perpetual trophy with the club's name engraved upon it. The winning club will receive an individual trophy for display, which will be presented at the Junior Livestock Auction.
