## Issues discussed:

- 1. COURTS
- OCJ: On November 12<sup>th</sup>, the OCJ issued a Notice regarding <u>CaseLines for Domestic Matters</u>. They also issued an updated <u>Scheduling of Family Matters at the Ontario Court of Justice Notice</u>.
- OCJ & CaseLines: The OCJ is beginning to roll out CaseLines in the second week of December.
- REMINDER SCJ SMALL CLAIMS COURT WORKING GROUP: FOLA is requesting that practitioners as well as Deputy Judges take a moment to consider and comment on what works well and also what could use improvement in our Small Claims Court so that constructive feedback can continue to flow to the Small Claims Court Working Group. - SCJ NOTICE: On November 19, 2021, the SCJ made significant updates to the family law section of Toronto's Notice to the profession which comes into effect today (except as otherwise noted in the Notice which is available <u>here</u>. This includes significant updates to provisions regarding in-person attendances (B.2), electronic filing and restrictions on materials (B.3), page limits (B.4), new early judicial intervention and procedural direction attendances (B.5), the scheduling of motion dates (B.6) and urgent matters (B.7).
- CAO NOTICE: On November 22, 2021, the Court of Appeal for Ontario issued a new Practice Direction Release Regarding Accessing Court Documents and Exhibits from Lower Courts for Purposes of Preparing Appeal Books in Criminal Appeals. You can read that on their home page <u>here</u>.

- ANTI-MONEY LAUNDERING & TERRORIST FINANCING: NEW BY-LAW AMENDMENTS IN EFFECT JANUARY 1, 2022: The Law Society's new by-law amendments aimed at combatting money laundering and terrorist financing will come into effect on January 1, 2022 and will have an impact on client identification and verification and cash transaction and trust accounting obligations for lawyers and paralegals. They've created resources to support licensees to assist with understanding and complying with the new requirements. <u>Visit: LSO.ca/amltf</u>
- NOMINATIONS FOR THE 2022 LAW SOCIETY AWARDS: Each year, the Law Society proudly recognizes Ontario lawyers and paralegals who have made outstanding contributions to the legal profession. Lawyers may be nominated for the Law Society Medal and the Laura Legge Award. Paralegals may be nominated for the William J. Simpson Distinguished Paralegal Award. Both lawyers and paralegals are eligible for the J. Shirley Denison Award and the Lincoln Alexander Award. Nominations are encouraged for members from all communities, practice areas, firm sizes, and regions across the province. ## 8. REQUEST FOR FEEDBACK:

The Professional Transcriptionists and Court Reporters Association of Ontario have reached out to FOLA seeking assistance on some issues they have been dealing with related to court transcripts. Specifically, the use of Zoom and teleconference proceedings have made transcription challenging and, as such, many records may not be fully reliable. As you know, certified transcripts are an important and integral facet of the judicial system.

Similarly, please email Katie if you have begun to appeal a matter and are experiencing challenges with the official transcripts.

## 9. REGULATION AMENDMENTS (PROPOSED)

THE MINISTRY OF MUNICIPAL AFFAIRS & HOUSING (MMAH): Proposed Changes for the Next Edition of Ontario's Building Code (Fall Consultation). As part of the development process for the next edition of Ontario's Building Code, the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing is engaging in consultation starting in Fall 2021 on some existing variations from National Construction Codes as well as a number of proposed changes that are unique to Ontario's Building Code.
