ONTARIO COURT OF JUSTICE UPDATES:

SCJ'S GUIDELINES TO DETERMINE THE MODE OF PROCEEDING IN CIVIL, FAMILY, CRIMINAL, & SCC:

The Ontario Superior Court of Justice's Guidelines to Determine the <u>Mode of Proceeding in Civil, Family,</u> <u>Criminal and Small Claims Court</u> came into effect on April 19, 2022. In his message to the Bar announcing the Guidelines on March 17, 2022, Chief Justice Morawetz explained that the Guidelines are living documents and would be reviewed in the new year after the Bar and the Court had some time to work with them.

Accordingly, the Office of the Chief Justice of the SCJ is seeking input on the Guidelines. The Guidelines set out the presumptive method of hearing for any given matter and were developed with consultation and input from the Bar, the Court's specialized working groups and the judiciary. Consideration of all justice participants' needs required a careful and thoughtful balance between the continued availability of both inperson and virtual attendances. The framework of those considerations are captured in the over-arching principles accompanying each set of the Guidelines and which inform the Court's application of them.

ONTARIO'S STANDING COMMITTEE ON JUSTICE POLICY

In advance of Ontario's Standing Committee on Justice Policy hearings on Bail Reform, FOLA sent our Submission for their consideration. In it, we reminded the Committee that an effective bail system is one which respects the presumption of innocence and the Charter right to reasonable bail and that Ontario's courts are subject to binding appellate jurisprudence on the considerations made during a bail hearing. REMINDER: ONTARIO'S NOT-FOR-PROFIT ACT: Ontario's Not-for-Profit Corporations Act (ONCA) took effect on October 19, 2021. Existing non-profits have 3 years from that date to bring their governing documents into compliance with the new law. Learn more on our <u>ONCA Resource Page</u>.

METROLINX UPDATE:

On Friday, February 3rd, the Law Society filed an Injunction Motion requesting a hearing to delay the removal of trees on the LSO grounds by Metrolinx. Over the weekend, a hearing on that Motion took place that resulted in a delay until midnight February 10, 2023, unless it is extended by further order of this court.
