MINISTRY OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL JUSTICE SERVICES ONLINE – LIVE (VIRTUAL) FEEDBACK SESSIONS

JSO TIP

Do you find you need to provide additional information to staff when processing documents? A little-known option allows you to do this. MAG introduced the 'Memo to Court Staff regarding a Submission' feature in JSO on November 15, 2021 but not many people know about this. This "memo" feature is available in the Family Submissions Online, Civil Submissions Online, Small Claims Court Submissions Online and Bankruptcy Submissions Online portals. The memo allows filers to provide additional information to staff when processing documents. For example, the memo could be used to indicate documents are being submitted pursuant to a court order. Currently, messaging about the memo can be found on the JSO portals at the point

when the filer is ready to upload documents (see below image). As part of a future iteration, MAG is working to make the messaging more prevalent in each portal for better awareness.

The ministry has also worked closely with the Superior Court of Justice and Ontario Court of Justice to provide enhanced guidelines on valid rejection reasons. The guidelines are publicly available on the Ontario court forms site (ontariocourtforms.on.ca) or directly through this <u>link</u>. These guidelines were also provided to court staff.

Upload the documents *
 Important information: Upload your completed documents by selecting the document type and clicking "Upload document". If you are submitting a Memo to Court Staff Regarding a Submission, you must ensure that this is the first document you are uploading. The Memo will not be saved to the court file or otherwise retained after your submission is reviewed. Each document must be in PDF or Word (.docx) format and cannot exceed 15 megabytes (MB). The latest versions of the court forms, available on the <u>Ontario Court Forms</u> & website, should be used. Please note, documents can be submitted in Word (.docx) format, however, PDF is the preferred format. The total size of all documents cannot exceed 50 megabytes (MB). Each page of the document must be letter sized (8.5" x 11") and portrait orientation. File names must contain only letters, numbers, spaces, underscores, periods, apostrophes, hyphens, brackets and French characters and must not exceed 255 characters (including the extension).
Documents
Begin typing the name of the document and the predictive text will provide a list of the forms. Press the spacebar to see the entire list. The available documents will depend on the type of case selected on the first page.
