COVID-19 - WEEKLY CHECK IN LOG #26

September 16, 2020 Summary

Invited participants: Sector calls

OBA, FOLA, LSO, LAO, the Advocates' Society, & OTLA Superior Court of Justices in Ontario, Court of Appeal for Ontario, & Ontario Court of Justice MAG – Political, Department staff, and the Recovery Secretariat

Issues discussed:

1. COURTS

- ❖ The OCJ issued a Notice on September 15, 2020 that the resumption of in-person criminal hearings at Gore Bay, Orillia and Woodstock and of in-person family hearings in Gore Bay and Woodstock will now proceed as of September 16th, 2020. See Criminal Notice here and the Family Notice here.
- ❖ The Courts have announced two Judicial Vacancies in Thunder Bay: one criminal; and one 50% criminal / 50% family. See details here.
- ❖ The SCJ will be sending out a Notice related to the Central East region tomorrow that will cover Motions, Trials, and Applications.

2. MAG

- ❖ The Ministry of the Attorney General has announced that both the Metro Toronto Convention Centre (MTCC) and the Pearson Convention Centre in Brampton are now prepared to host jury events.
- ❖ MAG, along with the Recovery Secretariat and the SCJ, continue to explore off-site locations for Jury Trials and are specifically looking at options in Ottawa.
- ❖ MAG reported that the response rate for Summons for Jury Duty is slightly lower than the normal 50%.

1. FINAL CALL: JUSTICE SECTOR CONSULTATIONS: MANDATORY MEDIATION AND ONE-JUDGE MODEL

Earlier this month, the Attorney General requested input and perspective from FOLA on legislative potential changes to the mandatory mediation program and a single-judge model (building on the current One Judge Pilot Program) in the SCJ. You can read our submission here.

2. LEGAL AID - CALL FOR ACTION

On August 20th, FOLA sent a letter to Justice Minister Lametti requesting he work with Ontario's Attorney General to address the shortfall in funding to Legal Aid Ontario as a result of the Law Foundation's

decreased revenues due to lower interest rates. You can read that letter <u>here</u>. - 3. FAMILY LEGAL SERVICES PROVIDER (FLSP) LICENSING MODEL CALL FOR COMMENT: The Law Society's Access to Justice Committee is inviting lawyers to provide comments on a FLSP Licensing model. The proposed scope of permissible activities, required competencies, and outline of the training program are detailed in the Access to Justice Committee's FLSP License Consultation Paper. To ensure we hear from Law Association members in advance of drafting our Submission, FOLA scheduled three Zoom meetings and have reached out to Presidents to delegate one or two members practicing in Family Law to attend. The final meeting will be held on Friday, September 18th from 9:00am to 10:00am. Attendance is limited to 100 people per meeting.
