



PET FIRST AID KIT

ESSENTIALS

My pet's information card: information including vaccinations, medications, and a current photo	Sterile saline eye solution: to flush out eye contaminants and wounds
Phone numbers: veterinarian, nearest emergency veterinary clinic, and poison control centre hotline	AUSTRALIAN ANIMAL POISONS HOTLINE (24/7) 1300 869 738
Nylon leash: to provide quick and easy control over your pet	Gloves: non-sterile or nitrile
Pet carrier or blanket: a safe, calming place for your pet for transport	Bottled water and bowl: to keep your pet hydrated
Nonstick bandages, towels, or strips of cloth: to cover wounds and control bleeding	Digital pet thermometer and lubricant: to take a pet's temperature by inserting rectally
Gauze rolls: for wrapping wounds or muzzling	Tape: duct, or medical
Clean towels: used with direct pressure to help control bleeding	Medications: have extra's on hand your pet is currently taking

ADDITIONAL SUPPLIES

First-aid book: outlines the basics of treating wounds and injuries	Hot/cold pack: to reduce swelling. Always use with a towel. Never use directly on pet.
Self-cling bandage: sticks to itself; not fur	Eye dropper: to give oral medications or flush wounds
Anti-bacterial wipes or pads: cleans surfaces and kills bacteria	Scissors: with blunt ends
Betadine solution: help prevent infection when treating a minor cut, scrape, or burn	Thermal Blanket: to help control hypothermia and shock
Triple antibiotic ointment: reduce the risk of infections following minor skin injuries	Paper towels and hand sanitizer: for human use
Q-tips: clean wounds and apply topical medication	Flashlight
Clean towels: used with direct pressure to help control bleeding
