



STORM CLEAN UP ASSISTANCE AVAILABLE

AmeriCorps teams will be in Cedar County assisting with removing trees and brush, chainsaw work, and helping tarp and secure homes with damage caused by the Derecho. If you have need for this service, you must call the Concern Hotline NO LATER THAN OCTOBER 5, 2020. To add your name to the list, please call 1-800-447-1985. (Some restrictions may apply).



FEMA INDIVIDUAL ASSISTANCE

Homeowners and renters in Cedar County may now apply for FEMA Individual Assistance for losses resulting from the severe storms on Aug. 10, 2020. Assistance provided by FEMA for homeowners can include grants for repairs to make their primary home habitable. Rental assistance is available to pay for temporary housing for homeowners and renters. Lodging expense reimbursement may be available to eligible households who may have stayed in a hotel for a short period of time. FEMA assistance can also help with other disaster-related needs like replacing essential household items, and medical and dental expenses. Businesses, homeowners and renters may be eligible for disaster loans from the U.S. Small Business Administration.

First, if you haven't already done so, contact your insurance company and file a claim for the disaster-caused damage you've suffered. You don't have to wait for FEMA to start cleaning up but be sure to take photographs or video of the damage and keep all receipts for repair work. **If you have losses not covered by insurance, contact FEMA by either going online to DisasterAssistance.gov or by calling the helpline at 800-621-3362.**

Applicants will need the following to apply. You can upload all required documents at DisasterAssistance.gov:

- Address of the damaged property
- Description of disaster-caused damage and losses
- Current mailing address
- *Current telephone number
- *Social Security number of one member of the household
- *Insurance information
- *Total household annual income
- *Bank account routing and account number for direct deposit
- *Save your FEMA registration number, also known as FEMA ID number.
- *Check your DisasterAssistance.gov account for updates.



Tetanus Information – Public Health

At this time during a disaster situation, people commonly ask questions about the risk of tetanus. According to the Iowa Department of Public Health, increases in diseases like Tetanus are not typically seen following disaster situations. However, injuries received during or following a disaster may increase the risk of the disease. Following the storm, Derecho, this is a good time to remind Cedar County residents to check their immunization records. If residents are unsure if they need to receive a tetanus containing vaccine, they should call their health care provider.

Storm/Roads/Rural Cleanup - Secondary Roads

Secondary Roads is only clearing trees that were blocking the roadways after the storm. With 950 miles of roads, they do not have staff or disposal space to pick up debris from residents placed in the right of way. Property owners are responsible for debris from their own property including proper disposal of that debris. Placement of debris in the ditch is considered illegal dumping and the property owner could be charged for the cleanup of such debris. Vital Records and Certain Registrations/Titles - Recorder's Office

The Governors Proclamation issued August 21st, 2020 allows for the replacement of Vital Records, Boat, Snowmobile, ATV or ORV registrations and/or titles in the Cedar County Recorder's Office due to them being lost, destroyed, or rendered illegible as a result of derecho that occurred on August 10, 2020. Open Burning Information– Emergency Management

As we continue to recover from the August 10th derecho, Cedar County Emergency Management is reminding all Cedar County residents of their responsibilities according to The Cedar County Burn Ordinance. Please note that this ordinance applies to rural residents; your local jurisdiction may have other restrictions or rules that pertain to open burning. Those who live in an incorporated jurisdiction are strongly encouraged to contact their local city hall regarding burning restrictions and ordinances.

If you are planning an open burn, you must first notify a Dispatcher on duty at the Cedar County Law Center with the following information:

- Name and phone number of the person responsible for the burn,
- the specific location of the burn
- the date and time that the open burn will be held.

An adult over the age of 18 must remain near the burn to attend it until the fire is extinguished. To notify dispatch, please contact the Cedar County Sheriff's Office at 563-886-2121, extension 4.

All residents are reminded to monitor the weather conditions prior to the open burn and to refrain from burning on windy days or during times of excessive dry conditions within the county or during declared burn bans.

REPORT ABUSE

Child Abuse – If you suspect a child under the age of 18 is being abused or neglected:

1. If you believe that the child is in imminent danger, CALL 911 immediately
2. Call the Abuse Hotline at 1-800-362-2178, available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
 - Be ready to provide identifying information and the whereabouts of the child
 - Unless you are a mandatory reporter, you may remain anonymous.

Dependent Abuse – Call the Abuse Hotline at 1-800-362-2178, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

EVICTED AND FORECLOSURE PREVENTION PROGRAM
