
Looking forward to seeing everyone at our meeting on September 10, 2025.

They went to Turkey as missionaries, and her husband later became head of the American Hospital in Istanbul. She has two children, a daughter and son, and several grandchildren. Mary Lou has been one of our most active members, holding many positions over these 19 years. She has been named an Honorary Member which, according to the by-laws, is conferred only upon one "who has given such worthy service to the Club as shall merit this distinction"

She was one of three chairmen of the Centennial Celebration, bringing much distinction to the club judging by the distinguished guests who were present at this extraordinary event. From my researching our history and speaking to members who have known Mary Lou from the beginning of her membership, she has accomplished many extraordinary feats for

Coco Plum.

Mary Lou has served on almost every committee and chaired many. She served as Second Vice President and has served as Program Chairman. The one service of hers most people speak about is as Yearbook Chairman, and, also, she started the roster. Many members lament that we no longer produce the yearbook booklet since it was very comprehensive. It included our club history with many historical pictures, the by-laws and many other features. I believe her yearbook won first place at FFWC. (We weren't called GFWC Florida then which came later.) She served as By-Laws Chairman and served on the Education, House, International Outreach, and Tea Party Committees, to name a few. Perhaps chairing the Historic Marker and Installation Committee was her crowning accomplishment for Coco Plum Woman's Club. She was able to bring our history up to date, and it is archived at the University of Miami.

Hi everyone! Happy summer's end as we look forward to another busy year with the Education and Libraries Committee.








We are reading **The Only Woman in the Room by Marie Benedict.** We will meet

Hello ladies.


