





The Coco Plum Woman's Club adds hope through all the community projects we support.

And for the smallest creatures, we have partnered with the Tropical Audubon Society to Adopt-A-Net. Our participation benefits migrating birds, field research and community outreach. During this fall migration season a net at the station will be marked as the Coco Plum Woman's Club adopted net. Our net is located along the South Loop at Bill Baggs State Park. During the migration season we will receive a list of the bird species from our net that were banded and released and a report of the overall banding season documenting the migration patterns. It has been reported that our net has caught, banded and released a couple of Ovenbirds. These birds are coming through in good numbers right now according to the Tropical Audubon Society.

We are in the peak time of the year for fall bird migration. Millions of birds are coming through South Florida as they are headed south for the winter.

They rest during the day and travel at night. Bright city lights can disorient them causing deadly collisions. "Lights Out Miami" is another opportunity to save our birds as they migrate through South Florida. For more information visit the Tropical Audubon Society Lights Out Miami.
