


EDUCATION and LIBRARIES COMMUNTIY SERVICE PROGRAM







We hope everyone's having a good summer, and staying cool in this heat. Remember the three "Rs" - **REDUCE**, **REUSE** and **RECYCLE!**

This is migration time for birds. Birds use the moon and stars to navigate. With light pollution in large cities, they can't see the moon and stars well, and get confused. Remember to turn all unnecessary lights off between 11:00 P.M. and 6:00 A.M. Also - Eco friendly adjustments to consider. Say no to plastic drinking straws. Reusable straws are available at Amazon and Walmart. They are economically priced, and often come with a carrying case. Take your own shopping bags to the store. Change (and this is a big challenge) from disposable plastic zip-lock baggies to the more eco-friendly reusable silicone version. While silicone isn't biodegradable, it is non-toxic and durable for many reuses. These can be found at Amazon as well.
