We will meet on September 21ST at Coco Plum. The books we picked to read over the summer were:


"The Searcher" by Tana French


and 2 books by David Baldacci
"A Gambling Man" & "One Good Deed"


We will be talking about these if you have read them. Don't forget to bring a bag lunch!


