Introduction to the Word Revealed Bible Study

This Bible study was created by Apostle Markita Brooks and distributed through The Truth In The Spirit. It is designed to disciple (train) believers in every area of life through a study of the entire Bible from a Hebrew Roots perspective. Each month (4-week period) has its own theme, and each week within the month has its own discipleship focus and suggested memory Scripture (to add weapons to your arsenal). Every day, we will read together a portion of the Torah (the Law of Moses), a portion of the remainder of the Tanakh (Hebrew Holy Scriptures / Old Testament) and a portion of the New Covenant (New Testament). This is to lay precept upon precept and allow the Bible to explain itself, revealing Messiah Yeshua throughout. If you continue faithfully through this study, we will read through the entire Bible in about a year, with some portions repeated as needed for understanding and reference. Theme for the Fourth Month: Preparation for Service

We all sin and fall short of the glory of God, yet in His mercy, He still calls us to join Him in His works. The Scriptures this month detail various types of service in the Old and New Covenants. Yet the themes are still the same: God chooses imperfect people to serve Him, God prepares His servants, only God can empower His servants and God corrects His servants to refine them. As you read the Scriptures this month, reflect on the various ways in which God has called you to serve (family, business, community, church, etc.). Then receive His instructions and corrections to you, His servant.

Week One Focus: God chooses His servants and builds a relationship with them to set them apart. As you grow closer to God, ask to see and understand all that He is doing to set you apart for service.

Week Three Focus: Though times get tough, the Lord will not allow His servants to suffer too greatly. What protection do you currently need from God?

Week Four Topic: Doing God’s Work God’s Way

Week Four Focus: One of the most important lessons God teaches us in preparation for service is to do His work His way. As God reveals ways in which you do His work your way, receive His correction and redirection.

Theme for the Fifth Month: The Responsibilities of Ministry

Ministers are God’s servants, ministering before God on behalf of the people and serving the needs of the people on behalf of God. All believers minister in some form or fashion. However, some believers are called to special areas of service. Those who have accepted this call must serve in accordance with God’s standards, and those who are served should appreciate God’s ministers and cooperate with them. Cooperation begins with understanding.
