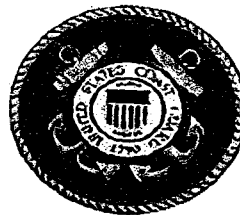
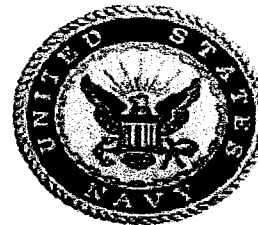

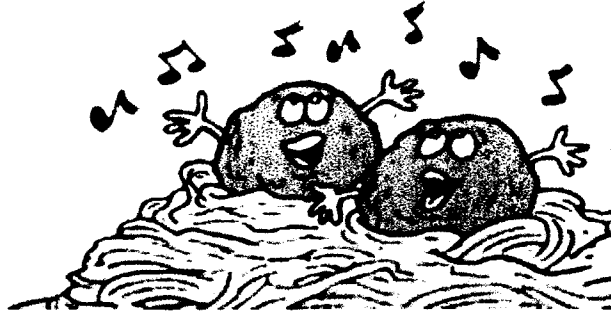

## **Commander's Corner**

With Mid-Winter behind us, we need to finish several items and continue to monitor others.

Greendale Veterans memorial: If you haven't purchased a brick, do so. Forms are in the east entrance, library, and welcome center, plus some may show up at the memorial itself. We won't have snow forever, so eventually the weather will warm up. You need time to complete the brick process. Sometime in Spring, the rest of the bricks will be placed. We still look for corrections on them, like names misspelled, words missing, etc. There will be a master list placed somewhere in the Village, so people can see where their bricks are.

Mid-Winter had several classes, but I think either because of the weather, or lack of interest, some came to take these classes and then went home. Through our meetings, the State Adjutant, Amber Nicolai, resigned. So now we have a search for a new State Adjutant. With the State Convention in Appleton this year, I would expect changes in individuals making choices on their commitment in moving up, and

also dropping out. I hope to get some of these classes that were at Mid-Winter, down here. This may include Funeral Honors Certification, M-1 training, Suicide Prevention, jobs of various officers, public speaking, etc. It's in the works.

Membership: We need a few members to step up and renew. We're that close to 100%. If you have some financial concerns let me know. We continue to look out for each other. In the past few months, we've gained some new members, so make them welcome. As I look over the landscape in many events that go on, I see a lot of freebies that non-members have been getting. Eventually, this will change. We have the Oratorical, Badger Boys State, Memorial Day, 4<sup>th</sup> of July, Village Days, and some events put on by the Department that are coming up. Some events not mentioned conflict with each other, so choices will be made as to which one to participate. We're making a BIG push to get this done. If you haven't paid, you're delinquent.

For Memorial Day, I anticipate the same schedule. At this time, even though the Memorial is there, we still have the Parade downtown, the school program, the early cemetery remembrance at Good Hope, the Annual Pancake Breakfast at the Post, and that's it.

Nomination of Officers/Elections: As I mentioned before, if you're interested in doing something or seeing how this Post operates, let us know, so we can work with you on learning a position. We

need some people to step up. It's not that difficult.

Homeless Task Force: We've managed to help many. Things are holding their own. I don't expect any surprises, but you never know. Pretty soon, the old buildings behind the VA Zablocki will have residences for vets to live. There are a lot of resources out there for the homeless. We've been turned away several times as clothing rooms are full, some facilities don't want items, but money and everything must be new. As a result, we've been helping some in dire need, with excess supplies. This will end. We continue to help our own.

Elections/campaigning, etc.: Shortly you'll see more candidates running for office, as a reminder, don't wear your Legion cover or other emblem materials to these functions. You know the rules. With these elections, will come robo calls. You need to go out and vote if you want change. This applies everywhere, at all levels.

It's getting close to fishing time. We're investigating some trips to make. We have our annual ball game, plus some other ideas.

We need some extra help at bingo, especially on Sunday night. Some of us could use a break. It's not that hard to do.

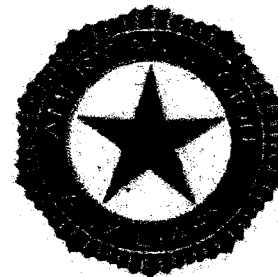
remember them for their years of service and contribution they have made to the post.

As a final reminder regarding 2020 renewal of membership, please read the information below from the office of the Wisconsin American Legion Auxiliary.

**Any member that has not paid their 2020 dues by January 31, 2020 will become expired and lose all Auxiliary benefits and privileges of membership including any officer or chairmen positions currently held until their dues are received by Dept. HQ/National.** Once processed, a member will be reinstated with no adverse effect.

Members may pay their dues by sending them to ALA Dept. of WI, PO Box 140, Portage WI 53901, going to the NATIONAL website: [alaforveterans.org](http://alaforveterans.org) or paying over the phone by calling NATIONAL between 7:30 am - 3:30 pm @ 317-569-4500.

The 2019 dues year is over and the same as above applies, any member that had not paid their 2019 dues by January 31, 2019 was not a member until their dues were received by

Department/National. What you need to do is pay your 2020 dues NOW to have your membership reinstated.

2019 dues can be paid at any point in time so that a member does not lose continuous years/join date. Per national policy, a lapse of a year will result in years/join date being changed.
