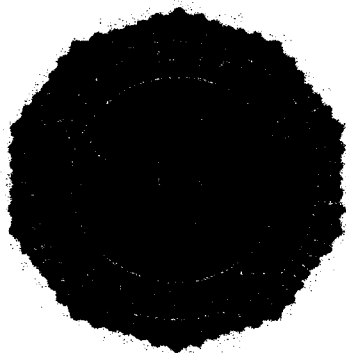
To all that sent me their emails thank you we are updating them in the main system . To anyone who has not please send it to me.

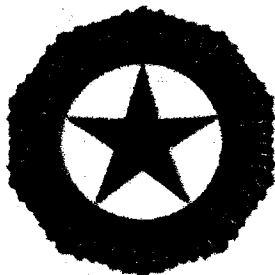

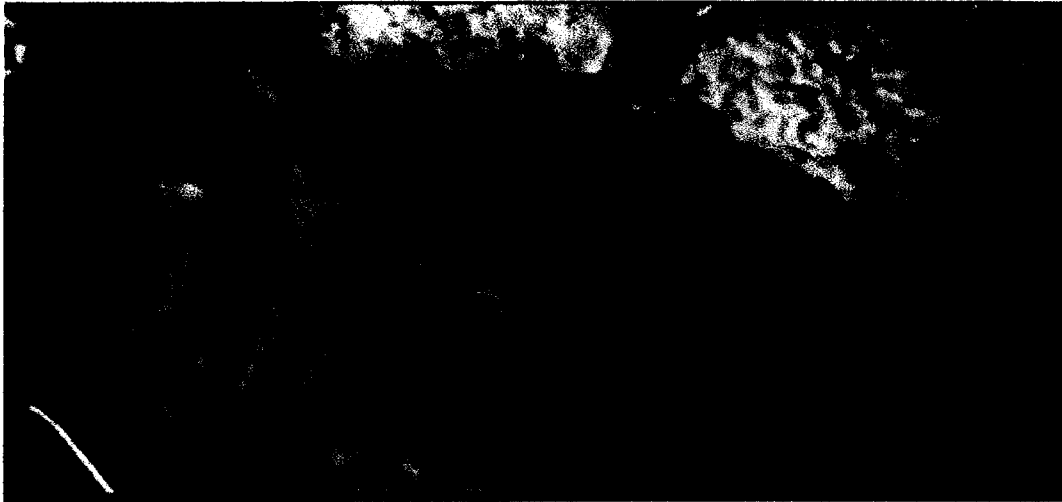

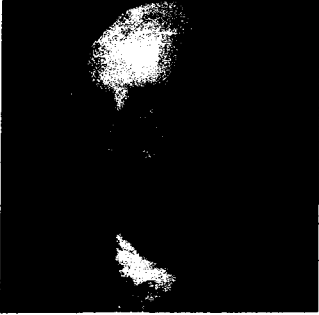
