Hello fellow legionnaires



In last month's issue of this newsletter, I mentioned that I would be doing short biographies of the members of the Americanism Committee. I will begin with myself:

Doug Phillips enlisted in the U. S. Navy right after his Custer High School graduation and was sent to Great Lakes Naval Station for boot camp in October of 1967. After camp graduation, I stayed at Great Lakes for 8 weeks of electronics school and was then sent to Bainbridge, Maryland for 16 weeks of Radioman "A" School to be trained in communications. My first duty station was Sidi Yahia, Morocco, Africa for 12 months. My next communications station was for approximately 22 months on the Admiral's Staff for the Commander of the Caribbean Sea Frontier, San Juan, Puerto Rico. I was discharged in Washington DC in August, 1971. From 1976 – 77, I was in the Naval Reserve Unit based in Milwaukee, Wis., and occasionally served on the ship, the U. S. S. Milwaukee, AOR-2 stationed out of Norfolk, Virginia.

Commander Tim Baranzyk enlisted in the U. S. Marine Corps and served from 1966 – 69. After doing his boot camp in San Diego, California, Tim was sent to Camp Pendleton where he was working in the kitchen when he came down with pneumonia. After regaining his health, Tim was sent to Camp Lejeune, North Carolina where he received artillery training. Once out of training his next duty station was Vietnam. While in Vietnam his job was to work with 8 inch artillery. Upon completion of this tour, Tim was sent to San Diego, California to serve out his military career as an MP (Military Police).

I will continue next month with two different members of the Americanism Committee.

Speaking of this committee, I have started to contact schools and senior centers to just keep in contact and to begin working on a few programs for the fall of 2021. I will keep our members posted on my success. Thank you for reading my article and please, stay safe.
