



Bob,

Attached is the yearly summary of Post 416 Honor Guard activities for the dates referenced above. This includes Military Funeral Honors as well as various other activities.

The Honor Guard conducted 82 Military Funeral Honors during this reporting period. The following page is a summary of the honors per service branch, honors per era, and honors locations, as well as the overall data for the year. I have also included a listing of each funeral, with the honored veteran's name and pertinent data. Please note that the average participation at these honors was a very impressive 9.6 participants per funeral. Thanks to all members of the Honor Guard for their dedication.

Also included is a calculation of mileage expended. I based this on a rounded off distance from Post 416 to the honors location times two, for round trip. I then multiplied each distance by the number of honors performed at each location. Also, based on an average participation of 9.6, we can conservatively say that an average of two cars were used for the honors. I therefore multiplied my calculated number by two to get the total mileage expended.

Lastly, I have included a listing of other miscellaneous activities the Honor Guard participated in and Honor Guard meeting attendance.

On behalf of all members of the Honor Guard, I would like to again offer a special thanks to our Captain, Bob Zolandz, for his leadership and guidance throughout this past year, and for the many years he has served as our Captain.
