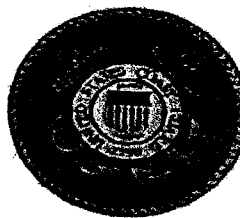

The parade committee selected one of our members to ride as a dignitary in one of the cars. Jim Cook represented us with honor. Thank you Jim.

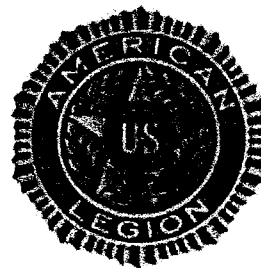

We are already halfway through the 2019 American Legion Auxiliary membership year and with the 2020 membership year fast approaching, we wanted to make sure you're aware that 2020 dues are now available to pay! ALA members can now pay their annual membership dues in 3 easy ways: by phone, online, or mail.

**Pay by phone:** Call National Headquarters at (317) 569-4570 with your member ID ready. You'll speak with

a real person who will assist you in paying your 2020 dues. If you would like to pay multiple members' dues at the same time, please call us, as this is the easiest way to accomplish this task. You can pay with a VISA, Mastercard, or Discover credit/debit card. We will send your membership card to you via email and mail, so please make sure your email address and mailing address has been updated in our member database.

**Pay online:** go to

[www.ALAforVeterans.org](http://www.ALAforVeterans.org) and click "Renew Here" in the top right corner. You will need to have an account already set up. If not, you'll need to create an account – it's fast and easy! Once you've logged in, click on the "Pay Dues." You will then be prompted to review your member info and input your payment information. You can pay with a VISA or Mastercard credit/debit card online. After your online payment has cleared, you'll receive an email with a copy of your 2020 membership card within a matter of minutes. National Headquarters will also send your membership card to you via USPS mail, so please make sure your current address appears in your online profile.

Mail your dues payment to your unit: Contact me, Carol Stephany, and let me know that you want to mail your 2020 dues payment. I can tell you exactly where to mail your check or money order. Please make all checks or money orders payable to American Legion Auxiliary Unit 416. If you prefer, you can visit our unit and pay your dues directly

to me! You can also check your mailbox in mid-September for your renewal notice.

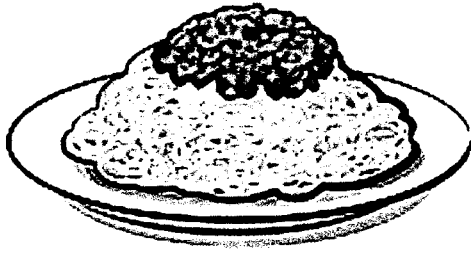
## **THANK YOU!**
