





Pastor Keith Knea to be installed June 16th



Dear friends in Christ,

As you are aware by now, Pastor Keith Knea has accepted the divine call to serve as our administrative pastor. We give thanks to God He has answered our prayers *"to send*

workers into His harvest field." (Matthew 9:38)

Although he was born in Evansville, IN, Pastor Knea lived in Michigan for several years. He went to school in Jackson, and then attended Kettering University in Flint, earning a Bachelors degree in Electrical Engineering. Answering our Lord's call to work in the harvest field, he attended Concordia Theological Seminary in Ft. Wayne, graduating with the Master of Divinity degree in 2008. His wife Sara has a teaching degree in Elementary Education from Concordia University, Chicago.

Pastor and Sara have four children: Elizabeth, who is a student at Purdue University; Joshua, who will be graduating from high school this spring; Joseph, who just finished his freshman year; and Jesse, who is 3 years old.



CONNECTING People To Jesus St. Michael's of Richville, Michigan

As we prepare to welcome Pastor Knea and his family, I'd like the members of St. Michael's to be mindful of several things as we begin a new chapter in our 173 years of history and ministry.

First, be thankful for Pastor Knea (and all our church workers, for that matter). Our seminaries have experienced declining enrollment for several years. We are not graduating enough pastors to replace those who are retiring or leaving the ministry. Until this trend is reversed, some congregations are going to have a difficult time finding a pastor to serve their churches. We had 8 calls declined before Pastor Knea accepted. The same is true for teacher graduates from our Concordias. There aren't enough of them to meet the vacant teaching positions in our Lutheran schools. If you are a young man or woman in our church, our Lord Jesus Christ needs you to answer His call too!

Second, let's keep our expectations realistic. Sometimes when a new pastor arrives people think that church attendance will go up, offerings will go up, school enrollment will go up, and everything will change for the better. A new pastor can't make all that happen. It can only happen if the members of the church, motivated by the *(Continued on page 2)* Holy Spirit, are determined to make it happen. We would do well to remember St. Paul's words to the Corinthians: "I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God made it grow." (I Cor. 3:8) What can you expect of a new pastor? You can expect him to do the things he will promise to do at his installation: "I promise to perform the duties of this office in accordance with these Confessions (of the Lutheran Church) and that all my teaching and administration of the Sacraments are in conformity with the Holy Scrip-(Lutheran Worship Agenda, pg. 225) tures." God told the prophet Jeremiah, "Let the one who has my word speak it faithfully." (Jeremiah 23:28)

Finally, we owe a word of thanks to the Call Committee. They served for three years and spent many hours reading paperwork on each candidate, conducting interviews, discussing the various candidates, and entertaining the pastors who came to visit. The members of the committee are Amy Bickel, Emily Bierlein, Heather Bierlein, Luke Bierlein, Mark Frank, Kristen Hecht, Mike Rogers, Becky Squanda, Jay Trombley, and Janice Weiss. I was impressed with how the members of the committee handled the work they were asked to do. After several years of meetings, deliberations, and having calls declined, it would have been easy to become impatient and frustrated. But this committee kept a positive attitude and stayed focused on what St. Michael's needed. "Well done, good and faithful servants!" (Matthew 25:23)

PRAYER PAL


