

Herman Sasse - "The Lie"

Herman Sasse was a Lutheran theologian, pastor, and professor during the mid-20th century. Born in Germany, he was one of the first Christian leaders who spoke out against the Nazis. He became friends with Deitrich Bonhoeffer, who was martyred shortly before WWII ended. Sasse survived the war and moved to Australia afterwards. He taught at Immanuel Seminary in the Lutheran Church of Australia.

Sasse wrote a number of books, and his lectures and essays have been extensively published. One of his most famous quotes is printed below. It was written in 1936 as part of a longer essay called "Union and Confession." Sasse realized that the Nazis were lying to the world and lying to themselves and, as a result, plunged the world into its most horrific period ever, with unprecedented genocide and bloodshed that cost the lives of tens of millions. He wrote these words:

"The lie is the death of man, his temporal and his eternal death. The lie kills nations. The most powerful nations of the world have been laid waste because of their lies. History knows of no more unsettling sight than the judgment rendered upon the people of an advanced culture who have rejected the truth and are swallowed up in a sea of lies. Where this happens, as in the case of declining pagan antiquity, religion and law, poetry and philosophy, life in marriage and family, in the state and so-

ciety — in short, one sphere of life after another falls sacrifice to the power and curse of the lie. Where man can no longer bear the truth, he cannot live without the lie. Where man denies that he and others are dying, the terrible dissolution [of his culture] is held up as a glorious ascent, and decline is viewed as an advance, the likes of which has never been experienced."

When I read this for the first time I thought, "Good grief, he's describing what's happening in the United States." LCMS President Matthew Harrison referred to this Sasse quote recently, pointing out how our own culture persists in telling and believing the most ridiculous lies like, "Women can become men and men can get pregnant." "Trans women are women." You probably have a emoji of a pregnant man on your phone. There was one pre-loaded onto my phone, along with hundreds of other icons. This completely contradicts human biology. Yet, people believe the lie (or they believe the deceptive ideology behind it).

"Marxism and Socialism haven't been given a fair chance. It will work if we just keep trying." Marxism has been tried over and over again, and fails miserably every time: brutal oppression and economic failure in the Soviet Union, millions dying in China's Great Leap Forward, the confiscation of private property under Fidel Castro, and Cambodia's Killing Fields tell the real story. "The Killing Fields" - a mov-

ie released in 1984 - is a motion picture every American should watch.

"Children don't need to be raised by a mom and a dad." "Police forces started out as slave patrols." "Legalizing drugs will solve the problems of crime, addiction, and treatment." "Abortion is a human right." "All white people are racist." We hear these persistent lies over and over again. God's Word warns us about the dangers of believing lies and falsehood. St. Paul wrote, "See to it that no one takes you captive through hollow and deceptive philosophy." Sadly, it seems that many political and cultural leaders in our nation are becoming what Herman Sasse warned against. The people who repeat and believe these lies view our society's decline "as an advance," and part of the "glorious ascent of our culture."

The need for the Biblical message of Law and Gospel, sin and grace, the Commandments and forgiveness through faith in Christ Jesus has never been greater. Our Savior said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life." Jesus prayed to His heavenly Father, "Sanctify them in the truth; Your Word is truth." We live in a world where people believe the most absurd things because it's trendy or because they are committed to a deceptive ideology. Sometimes people hear a lie repeated over and over again, and they assume it must be true. Part of our calling as God's people is to speak the truth to a world that desperately needs it. The real truth is that we are sinful people, separated from God and deceived by the devil, the world, and our sinful nature. But God sent His Son into the world to redeem us from it and ultimately take us out of it by His death on the cross and His resurrection from the dead. Jesus promised, "You shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free." Free from falsehood, free from error, free to live as God's people, and free from sin, death, and hell.
