#### IT'S A MATTER OF HEART

Stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God's family the church, in managing all of life and life's resources, for God's purposes. Faithful stewardship isn't just about saving, getting out of debt, and being generous. It's about seeking and applying God's wisdom and glorifying Him with what He has entrusted to us, whether it's financial, time, talents, abilities, and general wellbeing.



"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matt. 6 v 21

This passage is so true. Sometimes we get our priorities skewed. It's easy to get focused on lots of other things that distract us. We sometimes serve the wrong master. We need to remember who's we are, and that in Matt. 6 vs 24 we cannot serve two masters. "No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money."

Love is all about **heart**. When Jesus was asked what is the greatest commandment, He replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the first and the greatest commandment. And the second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself."

TITHING: Do you tithe? Do you make it a point to honor the Lord first, with your first fruits of your income? Or do we give according to what's leftover after paying all the bills? This is an important question for everyone. Think on this please, and pray for Godly wisdom. Do you now give a % as a tithe? In Old Testament times it was 10% first fruits giving. Now that's no longer required, however it's a very good practice to do 10% or more. Scripture instructs us that to whom much is given, much is required of them. It's a matter of the heart! For God loves a cheerful giver! God doesn't need anything. He already has everything! But what He wants- is your heart! Faith requires action! God deserves your best (your first fruits) after all He gave us His very best in Jesus.

You are unique. You have special talents and abilities. Use your spiritual gifts especially in the area of your **hearts** desire. What are you passionate about? The opportunities to serve are endless, but of course your church also needs you, to serve from the **heart**. Perhaps you're already serving in the area of your **hearts** desire. You're doing it.
