


Notes From Pastor Knea...




Stewardship Minute

Foreman on the Ranch or Faithful Manager

When you hear the word Stewardship what do you think of? You probably think of financial words that we are usually not that excited to discuss. Stewardship is simply managing something that belongs to someone else. The steward is the one who does the managing. They do not own the thing or things they are managing. To be a steward is like being the foreman of the ranch. The foreman isn't the owner. rancher is the owner. The foreman is responsible for the ranch and is accountable to the rancher. The LCMS church defines stewardship as the free and joyous activity of the child of God, and God's family the church in managing all of life and life's resources for God's purposes. What has God given you to manage? A family, friends, material blessings, a school and congregation, a farm, a job. In short, everything! So be a foreman on your Dude Ranch of life. Enjoy managing this life and its resources for God's purposes. They have been entrusted to your care by the owner of all.

Genesis 1:28 says, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it. Have dominion over the fish of the sea, the birds of the air, and all the living things that crawl on the earth"




Portals of Prayer Devotional Booklets


Please continue to pray for Lutherans for Life and all those working on the front lines for the cause of LIFE. We are Life and Lights shining in the darkness!

- Go to the St. Michael's webpage, "stmichaelsrichville.org" and scroll down and click on the "I Give Online" button. Click "Sign In"
- Scroll down to where it says, "Don't have a Giving Account?", and click on "Create one". Enter your Name, Address, and Email Address. Enter your bank account or credit card information.
- Choose a recurring donation (weekly or monthly) or a one-time donation. Once your account is open, you can select which fund(s) to donate to. The regular funds like Home Purpose, Missions, Capital Improvement, New Construction, and Church Technology, are available, but so are all the Endowment Funds and other various funds to select. There is also a new optional button to check if you want to pay an additional 2.5%, to help offset the processing fees.
