# Mission Fest : November 10

There aren't as many bookstores around like there used to be. These days people order a lot of books from Amazon or some other publisher, or we opt for e-books to download on a tablet. Nevertheless we still have access to all kinds of written material. There are millions of publications to chose from. We can order novels, how-to books, cookbooks, works of fiction and non-fiction. And, of course, we have access to dozens of versions of the Bible, Portals of Prayer and other devotionals, as well as best selling Christian authors like Max Lucado, Rick Warren, David Jeremiah, and many others.

Imagine living in a country where you couldn't even find a copy of Luther's Catechism. Or trying to find a Bible that was written in a language you could understand. Suppose you wanted to read simple Bible stories to your

children, but nothing was available. How could you teach them - and learn more about the Christian faith yourself - when very few Christian books are in print?

Lutheran Heritage Foundation, based right here in Macomb, Michigan, has printed and distributed Biblical and Lutheran books since 1992. They have published Christian books in 145 languages and distributed them in 90 countries. Lutheran Heritage Foundation has printed Luther's Small Catechism in 110 languages, and they are working on adding to that number. A Children's Garden of Bible Stories is popular with parents and young children. They've sent books to Christians in Bolivia, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, and Nepal, to name just a few places.

On November 10<sup>th</sup> we will welcome Pastor Matt Heise, the Executive Director of LHF, to St. Michael's. He will be our guest preacher for our annual Mission Fest. He will also speak during our Bible class hour to tell us more about LHF. Printing and publication of
