"HERE AM I, SEND ME!"

The prophet Isaiah spoke those memorable words at the beginning of his Old Testament book, responding to God's call for a prophet to go to His people. The same God calls out today in the words of our Savior Jesus: "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send workers into His harvest fields." An unfortunate trend in the Church today is that we have fewer and fewer pastors, Lutheran teachers, music directors, and overall church workers. This past spring, for example, a total of 82 pastoral graduates from our two seminaries were called to congregations in our Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod (42 from the St. Louis seminary and 40 from the Ft. Wayne seminary). A few more were placed in specialized cross-cultural or ethnic ministries. We are thankful for these 82+ new pastors. However, our church body needs almost double that many graduates each year to fill vacant churches which currently have no pastor.

I encourage every young man who is in high school, starting college, or thinking about a career change: Have you thought about serving Jesus Christ and His Church in the pastoral ministry? Throughout the history of the Church our Lord has raised up men to serve in this office. In I Timothy 3:1 St. Paul writes, "If anyone sets his heart on being an overseer (pastor or bishop), he desires a noble task." St. Paul goes on to list a number of qualifications for a pastor in chapter 3: "able to teach, hospitable, respectable, self-controlled," and so on. Some of you are saying to yourself, "I really don't think I can do that." I am sure that, when we were younger, every pastor had moments of doubt, wondering, "Maybe this isn't the right career for me." I know I did! But our Lord equips us with the gifts and abilities to carry out the public ministry and, as we gain experience, we hone those skills so the Holy Spirit can use us as "workers in His harvest fields."

Our Church also has a tremendous need for Lutheran School teachers, administrators, music directors, missionaries, and other workers. Thousands of students have passed through the doors of St. Michael's Lutheran School. In an increasingly secular and - dare I say - pagan world in which we live, the need for Christian





education has never been greater! Please prayerfully consider these opportunities for service in our Lord's kingdom. For more information we invite you to talk to one of our pastors or teachers. 


