



Making Your Own Jelly Roll for a Jelly Roll Rug

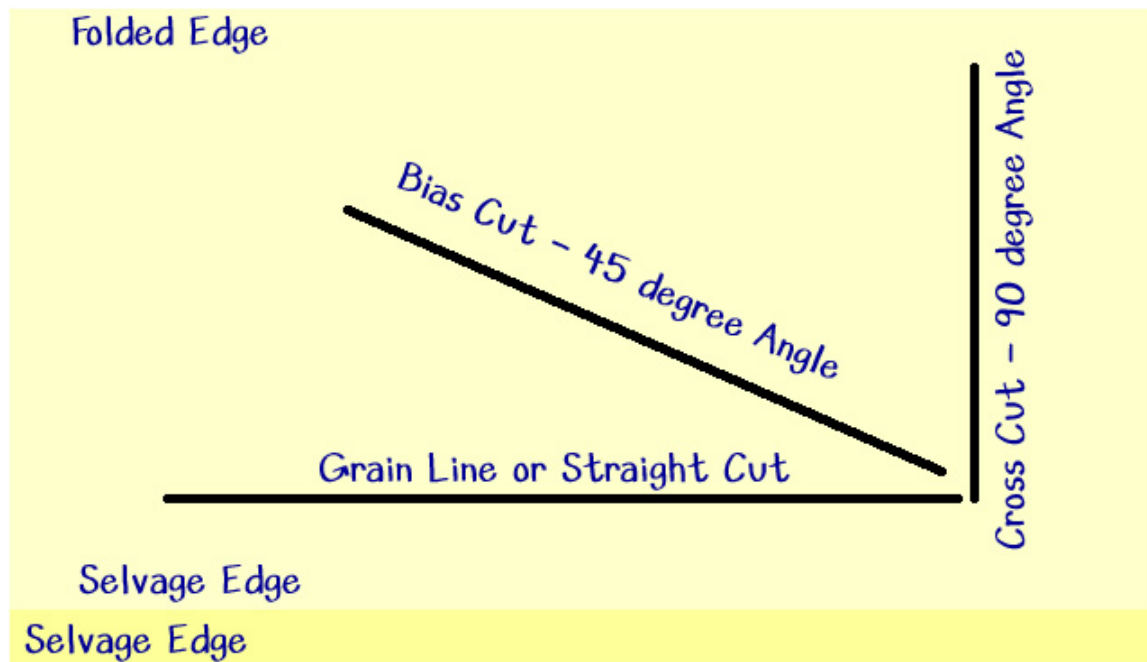


How Much Fabric is Needed

Want learn how to calculate the Number of Strips needed along with the total amount of yards for any size rug? Download the Calculate Fabric Strips PDF. It will explain the process.

For a regular size Jelly Roll Rug that has 40-42 strips you will need a total of 3 yards. For Example: if you want to use 3 different colors that would be 1 yard of each color.

3 Different Types of Fabric Cuts



The Grain Line runs parallel to the Selvage Edges. Cutting with the Grain is called a Grain Line Cut or a Straight Cut. A Straight Cut is very stable and has the least amount of stretch.

The Cross Grain Cut runs perpendicular (90° Angle) to the Selvage Edges. Cutting across the Grain is called a Cross Grain Cut or just a Cross Cut. A Cross Cut has stability along with some stretch.

The Bias runs at a 45° Angle to the Selvage Edges. This is called a Bias Cut. A Bias Cut offers the most stretch and drape, making it ideal for garments.

Which Cut is the Best for a Jelly Roll Rug?

A Cross Cut is suited best for making a Jelly Roll Rug. The reason is because this cut offers Stability along with some Stretch. The Cross Cut will allow the fabric to stretch around the corners of the Jelly Roll Rug during the sewing process.

What Supplies are Needed to Cut the Jelly Roll Strips?

- Cutting Mat
- Rotary Cutter
- Cutting Ruler

What size are the Jelly Roll Strips?

All of the Fabric Strips will need to be 2.50" wide by the Length of the Fabric.

What are the Pros & Cons of Cutting My Own Fabric Strips?

Pros:

- Choose my own fabrics
- Use fabric from my stash
- Save Money

Cons:

- Extra Time needed for cutting the Fabric Strips
- Have to decide on Fabric Colors, Prints and Layout
