


The Monoliths

1. 30 - 1x4x8 finish pine @ 10.25 = 308
2. 13 - 2x4x8 stud @ 3.25 = 43
3. 1 - 1/2x4x8 osb @ 20
4. 10 - 2x6x8 cedar @ 9.03 = 91
5. Paint @ 100


Equals about 600 times 6 = 3600

The Stones

1. 4 - 1/2x4x8 @ 20 = 80
2. 8 - 2x4x8 stud @ 3.25 = 26
3. Paint = 50

Equals about 156 times 6 = 1000

For a total of 4600 - approximate
