Agency Comments:

IHR:

- Joe announced that things are busy. They will be having two new staff members starting in June. One is going to be a Masters level intern and the other one already has their Masters, one will be working with kids and the other will be working with both kids and adults.

- The school counselors will be working in house this summer. They hope this will assist with the waitlist.
- Considering MRT. MRT is a program they do with adults but they do have a counselor trained to do juveniles. It has been a couple years since they have worked with juveniles in that capacity but they are hoping to do one this summer. It would be a 10-12 week program, an anger control group.

Safe Journeys:

- Susan announced it has been busy, schools are finishing up so that will give their prevention staff to start doing a lot more table work.
- Their Mental Health Therapist has begun and just completed her training, she will be starting to take on cases.
- They are interviewing for part-time shelter advocate and a shelter director.
- They are limiting their hotel money for the rest of the summer.
- June 3rd-25th the "Well, What Were You Wearing" exhibition about Survival is being displayed upstairs at The Art Center by Greater Livingston County Art Council.

Futures:

- Patty announced they are in budget season and they need to get it together by June 30th.
- Transportation is continuing to take up a lot of time, which is a good thing. They have taken on Iroquois County, they are looking for a driver around that area.
- The Spring Matching Grant was extended and has been very successful.
- The Golf Outing is June 12th and then Denim and Diamonds on September 10th. Currently the Denim and Diamonds tickets are 25% off till July 1st.
