President Jack Vietti called the 708 Board meeting to order.

It was moved by Vicki and seconded by Rose to approve the September 19, 2017, 708 Board minutes. Motion carried.

It was moved by Steve and seconded by Debbie to approve the September check listing. Motion carried.

It was moved by Vicki and seconded by Steve to approve September, 708 Board financial statements. Motion carried.

Executive Director Report:

- Chris distributed a revised FY18 Budget for 708 and 377 Boards. Due to the tax levies for FY18 there is an increase in both budgets as reflected in this new report.
- Chris collaborated with probation regarding a wife whose spouse had been taking her payroll checks to support his drug habit. It was necessary to get her out of that living arrangement until alternative living arrangements were found. 708 funding paid for 3 nights and Probation funding paid for an additional 2 nights in a local hotel. The Homeless Coalition was contacted to help assist the woman find different living arrangements.
- A futures client who was agitated at work and acting out was due to his neighbors in Chatsworth intimidating him and he was afraid to go home. He spent a couple of nights in a hotel until circumstances had a chance to calm down and is now living back at home.
- The Mental Health First Aid training will be held tomorrow at OSF St. James Hospital.

Old Business:

- None.

New Business:

- Chris inquired with the Boards if the December 21st meeting date should be changed due to the fact of being so close to Christmas. Both Boards are fine with keeping the December 21st date for the 708/377 Board meeting and the Christmas Open House.
- Chris referenced the IHR Budget summary sheet regarding their funding and the breakdown of services and percent of budget spent so far August. The Crisis services provided to the Livingston County jail is well over the amount budgeted. At the September meeting the topic of changing the Crisis services to a grant versus being fee for service had been discussed. Joe would like to see an increase of \$10,000 in the Crisis services to the jail for FY2018.

The 708 Board decided to table topic of the Crisis services topic until the December meeting after Livingston County votes on the overall FY2018 budget.

Institute for Human Resources:

- Joe reported Operation Snowflurry will be held next Saturday at Central School in Pontiac. The program is open to all Livingston County 4th and 5th graders. Operation Snowflake will be held in the spring.

Futures Unlimited:

- Patty reported they continue to keep busy. They were able to give everyone a very well deserved raise from anywhere from 25-75 cents per hour. Everyone was very appreciative. They continue to have ongoing behavioral issues with a few individuals. Patty remarked that Chris and staff plus DHS have been working with them to resolve these issues. DT and CILA are very busy. Exact Packaging will have a couple upcoming contracts for Futures Unlimited staff. One contract is temporary for DT staff packing funding raising boxes. SeedBalz has slowed down but they have picked up a couple more contracts for next season. Work at Caterpillar continues with all 3 shifts. Patty reminded everyone about their fundraiser Breakfast with Santa that will be held on Sunday, December 3rd.

OSF:

- Meagan is now working at the OSF St. James Hospital in room Suite 207 working with individuals with behavioral health needs. Meagan contacts Joe Vaughan often to get his input on many issues.
