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Ride to Hospital: Helping Rural Patients with no Transport Access to Hospital Project Abstract

Abate Manniso Family Operated Charity is seeking a grant to start "Ride to Hospital" service to help patients who do not have access to commercial transport to come to hospital when they need. It is aimed to start giving the service in Gibe Woreda by making 2 trips between each Kebele's clinic and Homacho Hospital with the intention to expand the service as much as possible. The need for such service as been assessed and inevitable. For the project one off road double cab truck and one year operation cost grant of \$5,000 is requested.

Statement of Need

In Gibe Woreda, has xxx people in 9 kebeles where commercial vehicles go rarely during dry times. Many people don't afford to pay for the commercial vehicles even if they happen to come to hospital when those commercial transport available. Even if they want to pay what they have for those transport, they are not convenient for both the patient and other passengers. Counting all these, it is not thinkable to count on commercial transport for rural patients to come hospital using them. People in the area use traditional 4 persons carrying stretchers if the hospital is nearby their area in a sever condition. Those who live far from the hospital are left to die. Visiting hospital before getting to sever illness is not practical due to the problem.

Program Description

The "Ride to Hospital" project will enable those people living in the inaccessible transport area to visit hospital when their illness is not managed by local clinic before illness get sever and too late to get treatment. Vehicle will arrive to pick them to hospital and drop them back to their kebele each day including taking them to their home as road permits. They are not asked to pay at front for the transport service but the bill will be sent afterward. Fair cost recovery amount will be charged and payment will be adjusted based on ability to pay.

Goals and Objectives

The goal of the Ride to Hospital Project is to reduce or avoid preventable death of the Woreda rural patients and able to live healthy quality life. Studies has shown preventive health care is the best and least expensive to the patient. Healthy people can reduce burden the health care and generate wealth to themselves and the nation. The main objective is elimination of need for traditional stretchers carried by persons.
