Thoughts from your Regional Minister – reflections about regional ministry, congregational ministry, and reflections from personal study.

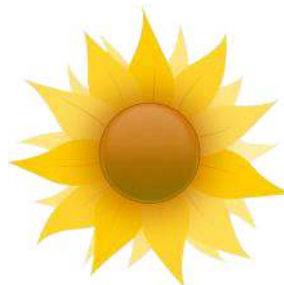
Leadership and Spiritual growth articles – articles on topics such as stewardship and finance, communication, mission, and more.

CCK GRANT OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOUR CHURCH



The Kansas region offers several grants to clergy, laity and congregations for ministry support

and enhancement. Two of those are Kansas Bible Chair Grants and Reconciliation Grants.

Established by the Kansas Women's Board of Missions, the Kansas Bible Chair provides grants for educational programs and lectureships which will benefit both laity and clergy of Disciple congregations in Kansas.

Funds from the Reconciliation Special Day Offering in the fall provide grants for pro-reconciliation/anti-racism programs. The Reconciliation offering is divided, with one half staying in our region and one half used by General Reconciliation Ministry.

Deadline to submit grant applications for the Kansas Bible Chair Grant and Reconciliation Grant is Tuesday, April 30. Applications and guidelines can be found at www.kansasdisciples.org/resources. Send completed application forms to scd@kansasdisciples.org.

2019 CLERGY RETREAT FEATURES GENERAL MINISTER AND PRESIDENT TERRI HORD OWENS



All Kansas Clergy are invited to three days of rest, fellowship, and learning April 23-25 at our beautiful camp and conference center.

Each year during the last week of April clergy from around the region of Kansas at the Disciples

Center at Tawakoni gather for fellowship and conversation with a resident theologian.

Our guest scholar this year is General Minister and President Terri Hord Owens. She was elected to that role on July 9, 2017. A Disciple since young adulthood, Owens's ministry and intellectual interests include

theology of reconciliation, cultural intelligence, developing inclusive and multi-cultural congregations, and mentoring youth and young adults.

Rev. Owens will give several presentations around the theme "Leading Through Points of Collision" which will help ministers who attend think about how to manage differences in our churches and communities.

NEWS FROM THE GENERAL CHURCH

PREPARE YOUR CHURCH FOR WINTER WEATHER



Christmas and eggnog may be on your mind, but now's the time to think about protecting your church against damage from snow, ice, and freezing temperatures. Knowing what to do and when can help you avoid losses.

Disciples Church Extension Fund (DCEF) helps congregations plan and finance Holy Places to be used for ministry, so they know our way around churches. Here's a snippet from their winter maintenance guide:

Pipes

Know where and how to shut off the main water valve.

Use insulation on water pipes that are exposed to freezing temperatures, cold drafts, and unheated or non-insulated areas.

Close windows near water pipes and cover open-air vents.

When temperatures drop really low, turn interior faucets to a slow drip.

Roof and Gutters

Search for cracking, blistering, cupping, peeling, or loss of granules on asphalt shingles.

Check drains, downspouts, gutters, and valleys to see that nothing prevents water from draining off.

Lead roof runoff away from the foundation.

Ice Dam Prevention

Ensure the attic has sufficient insulation and ventilation. Seal other attic openings.

Using a snow rake to clear snow 2-3 feet back from all roof edges.

CAMP SUNFLOWER RECEIVES NBA GRANT



Pine Valley Christian Church in Wichita received a \$5000 grant from the NBA Mission and Ministry Grant Program for Camp Sunflower, a summer camp experience for teens in the LGBTQ community. Camp Sunflower promotes safety and acceptance, resulting in self-knowledge and development of leadership skills.

For the second year of the program, the National Benevolent Association is granting a total of \$157,900 to 20 Disciples projects and ministries working with older adults and at-risk children and youth.
