Transport goods across borders using reliable international shipping methods.

Complete the process by delivering goods to the customer's designated location.



Create and confirm shipping orders with all required details for international delivery.



Breathing difficulty

Ensure goods pass through customs by complying with regulations and providing required documents.




Bleeding or trauma

Deliver items to local distribution centers for final processing.





Initial Response:



Primary Responder (On-Scene Staff):

Step 1

Perform initial assessment (responsiveness, airway, breathing, circulation).

Move the victim only if there's danger or it's safe to do so.

Begin care:

Unresponsive, no pulse: Start CPR and apply AED.

Breathing but unresponsive:

Monitor and place in recovery position.

Bleeding:

Apply direct pressure, elevate limb if needed.

Seizure:

Protect victim's head, do not restrain, monitor breathing post-seizure.

Support Staff:

Bring emergency equipment (AED, first aid, oxygen).

EMS Contact:

Call 9-1-1 or follow facility emergency call procedure.

Crowd Control & Scene Safety:

Assign staff to meet EMS at entry point.



Provide:

Facility address and location of incident Victim condition and care being provided Entry instructions for EMS




Transportation

Track the shipment in realtime to ensure timely and secure delivery.




Determine the most efficient routes to optimize delivery times and costs.


Initiate the transportation process, ensuring vehicles are ready and loaded.

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Post-Incident Procedures

Document

Complete detailed incident report (witness info, timeline, care provided).

Practice

Schedule and document regular EAP drills for medical scenarios.

Review

Staff review of EAP every quarter or after any real emergency.



Restock

Secure and restock all emergency equipment.

Report

Report to appropriate agencies (as required by policy or law).

Debrief

Secure and restock all emergency equipment.
